Curriculum Vitae

Nikos Christofis was born in 1981 in Larissa, Greece. He graduated from the Turkish Studies Department at University of Cyprus in 2003. Then, he enrolled to the Middle Eastern Studies Department, University of Manchester to pursue a master's degree in Middle Eastern history with focus on Turkey. After finishing first in the Greek national exams in the field of Turkish Studies, he was granted a 3-year scholarship to pursue his doctoral studies. He is expected to defend his doctoral dissertation on the 3rd of February 2015 at the University of Leiden in the Netherlands. He taught a history seminar on Turkish political history at the Turkish Studies Department, University of Cyprus and Turkish courses in the Institute for Balkan Studies in Thessaloniki, Greece. He edited and annotated a Turkish grammar (in Greek), and he is preparing for publication his MA thesis, titled *Demonizing the Other: Greek Views on Turkey during the Asia Minor Campaign, 1919 – 1922*. He has published articles and book reviews in edited volumes and academic journals. His most recent article has the title “Turkey, Cyprus and the Arab Uprisings” and will appear in a collected volume in 2015. He is one of the field co-editors of Ottoman and Turkish Studies, *Dissertation Reviews* and editor and member of the editorial board of the e-journal *Athens Journal of Humanities and Arts* (AJHA).
