Curriculum vitae

Willem Bastiaan (Bas) van Bockel was born in Amsterdam on January 30, 1973. He attended the St. Nicolaaslyceum in Amsterdam, where he graduated in 1992. He studied civil law and business law at Leiden University between 1993 and 1999, and during the last years of his studies he worked as research assistant to Prof. P.J. Slot. After graduating in 1999, he joined Clifford Chance LLP as a legal practitioner. In 2002 he was involved as *rapporteur* in the legal evaluation of the functioning of the Dutch competition act, commissioned by the Netherlands Ministry of Economic Affairs and carried out by a team of researchers from Leiden University. Between 2002 and 2009, he was a junior lecturer and PhD-fellow at the Europa Institute within the department of Public Law at Leiden University, where he specialized in EC competition law and Third Pillar law. In 2007 he conducted part of his PhD-research at the European University Institute in Florence. In 2009 he was involved as a senior competition law expert in the European Commission project 'Strengthening the Ministry of European Integration' in Tirana, Albania.

As a visiting lecturer, he has taught EC law courses at bachelors, masters, and post-graduate level at Bilgi Üniversitesi (Istanbul, Turkey); Tallinn University of Technology (Tallinn, Estonia); Universitas Indonesia (Jakarta, Indonesia) and The Hague University.
