From 2000 through 2002 he followed the MA program of social sciences at the Catholic University of Parahyangan in Bandung with a focus on International Relations. From 2003 onward he began to teach at Dili University and became Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities and Deputy Vice-Chancellor. From 2005 through 2006 he was a member of the national sub committee for the accreditation of universities at the Ministry of Education in Timor-Leste. From October 2009 through January 2010 he was an academic visitor at Birmingham University in the UK. From 2009 through 2014 he was a PhD within the research project *Becoming a nation of readers in Timor-Leste: Language policy and adult literacy development in a multilingual context* at Tilburg University and Leiden University.
