About the author

Zhongxiao Wang was born in Zoucheng, China, on 3 November 1984. After completing his secondary education at Jining Experimental High School in 2003, he enrolled as a student at Jiangxi Agricultural University in Nanchang. He graduated with a BA degree in Chinese Linguistics in July 2007. Following this he moved to Fudan University, where he started to study western classical languages and Graeco-Latin Literature, and specialized in Roman History. He finished his Master's thesis *cum laude* in 2010. In the same year he became a PhD researcher at the Leiden University History Institute. He completed his dissertation after four years. In 2014 one of his papers was published in China's top journal in Humanities & Social Sciences.
