## Curriculum Vitae

Michał Wiktor Marciak was born on the 16th of March, 1981, in the city of Kraków, Poland. From 2000 to 2007, he studied Theology at the Pontifical Academy of Theology in Kraków, Poland, where he graduated with a MA in Theology, majoring in Biblical Studies. From 2002 to 2007, he also studied History at the Jagiellonian University in Kraków, Poland, where he graduated in 2007 with a MA in History, majoring in Jewish Studies. From 2007 to 2012, he pursued his doctoral studies (PhD) at the Jagiellonian University in Kraków, and from 2008 to 2012 at Leiden University. In 2010 both universities signed the *cotutelle* agreement concerning Mr. Marciak's PhD studies. Besides his studies in Kraków and Leiden, he conducted his MA and PhD research at Ruprecht-Karls-Universität Heidelberg, Germany (August 2006); Friedrich-Schiller-Universität Jena, Germany (October 2006-March 2007); the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Israel (February-August 2008); Friedrich-Schiller-Universität Jena, Germany (October 2008-January 2009); Indiana University-Bloomington, the USA (January-May 2010). Mr. Marciak's research has been awarded several grants and stipends, among others, by the Deutscher Akademischer Austausch Dienst, the Stichting Fonds Marinus de Jonge, the Ryoichi Sasakawa Young Leaders Fellowship, the Foundation for Polish Science, the Rothschild Foundation (Hanadiv) Europe, and the National Science Centre in Poland. He holds C2 certificates in German (ZOP, Goethe Institut, 2007) and English (CPE, the British Council, 2010) and is author of a dozen papers on the literature and history of Palestine and the Middle East in the Persian, Hellenistic and Roman periods published in English, German and Polish.

Since the 1st of September of 2012, Mr. Marciak has been appointed as a research fellow for Ancient History and Oriental Studies at Rzeszów University, Poland.
