Christie Schoenmaker werd geboren op 26 augustus 1988 te Voorburg. In 2006 behaalde zij haar VWO diploma aan het Zandvliet College te Den Haag. In datzelfde jaar begon Christie aan de opleiding Pedagogische Wetenschappen aan de Universiteit Leiden, waar zij in 2009 de bacheloropleiding Gezinspedagogiek en in 2011 de research-masteropleiding Developmental Psychopathology in Education and Child Studies afrondde. Tijdens haar studie aan de Universiteit Leiden deed zij ervaring op in onderzoek en onderwijs als student-assistent bij de afdeling Algemene en Gezinspedagogiek (AGP). Zo was zij onder andere coördinator van de pre-master Pedagogische Wetenschappen, uitvoerder van een pilot-onderzoek in kinderdagverblijven en werkgroepdocent bij verschillende statistische vakken.
