P. LEID. INV. F. 1948/3.4: A NEW FRAGMENT CONCERNING MARKET TAXES IN OXYRHYNCHOS



INTRODUCTION

The papyrus published below contains a very fragmentarily preserved report to a royal scribe and deputy-strategus of the Oxyrhynchite Nome. The document is incomplete at the left and the bottom, and in fact only the opening part of the report is preserved. A publication of this fragment is, however, warranted by the fact that this type of document is not amply attested and that it presents, even in its fragmentary state, some interesting new features. The fragment was acquired in 1948 by the Rijksmuseum van Oudheden at Leiden from the wellknown dealer E. von Scherling 1.

The name of the addressee of the report has not been preserved and the available documentation does not allow us to restore it2. The report was sent in by a person representing a body of epiteretai or inspectors and collectors of taxes operating in the town and province of Oxyrhynchos3. Lines 6-8 indicate that the report dealt with the tax collection process during a month Pharmuthi in the reign of the emperor Gordian III, and this indication enables us to establish the date of the fragment with some precision. As the month of Pharmuthi covers the period 27.iii-24.iv, and as the first possible Pharmuthi under Gordian falls in the year A.D. 2394, whereas the latest possible Pharmuthi fell in A.D. 2435, the report was presumably drawn up not long after 24.iv in some year between A.D. 239 and 243. Incidentally, it should be pointed out that the titulature of Gordian found in this papyrus seems to present a novelty6.

The most interesting question about this fragment is, in my opinion, the nature of the taxes which were collected. A search for parallel documents leads us to compare SB XVI 12695 = P. Lond. inv. 1562, verso⁷, and P. Köln V 228⁸. Both texts deal with reports of market taxes in Oxyrhynchos sent in by ἐπιτηρηταὶ ἀνῆς Σαραπείου (SB XVI 12695.3) or ἐπιτηρηταὶ ἀνῆς ἀγορα() Σαραπείου (P. Köln V 228.3-4). For these Oxyrhynchite market taxes see now the discussion by A.K. Bowman⁹. The kind of epiteretai found in this text does not seem to have been previously attested ¹⁰, but their title may be compared with the function of the officials mentioned in PSI VI 692.1-3 (52/53 A.D.):

For the restoration of παντο|πωλικήν in line 2 cf. line 12, παντοπωλικὸν ἐργαστήριον, and line 13-14, τῆ παντοπω-[λικῆ. At the start of line 3 the editor suggested a restoration of [καὶ ἄλλας ἀνὰς 'Ο]ξυρυγχίτου, but in view of our text one may consider a restoration of [πόλεως νομοῦ 'Ο]ξυρυγχίτου. It is well known that epiteretai and ascholoumenoi performed more or less the same function 11, i.e. they supervised the concession and collection of taxes, in the present case those on general retail and pickling. The report they sent in concerned the taxes collected during the month Pharmuthi in one of Gordian's regnal years 12.

Notes

- There is no obvious candidate whose name may be restored at the start of this line. Cf. the list of Oxyrhynchite strategi compiled by Whitehorne 1978, 179-180, for the period under review.
- I have not been able to identify this man with any namesake in Oxyrhynchite papyri already published.
- This type of epiteretai is new (cf. above, the introduction). For ἀνή = "tax concession" cf. Hohlwein 1912, 431-32.
 - παντο(πωλικῆς): from παντοπώλης = "general retailer"; for words on -πώλης cf. Casarico 1983, 23-37.
- 4) For the ταριχηρά = "pickling business tax" cf. Browne 1970, 63 ff., esp. 66 and 67, note to line 7. Originally I had looked for words on -ηρά in Kretschmer/Locker 1963, 2, where ταριχηρά is not listed. The word is also not listed in LSJ or in Preisigke 1925-1931. The explanation for this remarkable omission may be that Preisigke (followed in this by LSJ and Kretschmer/Locker) took ταριχηρά to be the feminine form of the adjective ταριχηρός (which, in itself, is in principle correct, as one derives feminine substantives on -ηρά denoting taxes from ἡ -ηρὰ ἀνή; cf. Mayser 1970, I.3 96, and Buck/Petersen 1945, 347.

- V 228.6; in its present form the restoration may seem a bit too long, but possibly one should abbreviate $\lambda \acute{o}\gamma o \varsigma$ into $\lambda (\acute{o}\gamma o \varsigma)$.
- 6) I have not found a precise parallel for what one should restore at the start of this line in the lacuna. | |ας might be the end of ἡμέρ||ας, but then one would expect something like ἀπὸ ἡμέρ||ας α < ἔως > λ μηνὸς Φαρμοῦθι, cf. P. Köln V 228.7-8. The iuxtaposition of the numerals α λ reminds one of the similar use in receipts for penthemeros; cf. Pap.Lugd.Bat. XII 6. So much is certain that the report covered the whole 30 days of the month Pharmuthi.
- At the start of this line one expects an indication of the current regnal year of the emperor Gordian III. Years 2-6 are possible (cf. above, the introduction). Restore something like [τοῦ ἐνεστῶτος - (ἔτους) Μάρκο]υ.
- 8) It is not quite clear to me what can have stood at the start of this line. There are no papyri with an element between Γορδιανοῦ and Εὐσεβοῦς in Gordian's titulature, cf. Bureth 1964, 113. In Latin inscriptions from Africa one finds sometimes an element invictus between Gordian's name and pius (cf., e.g., the inscriptions listed by Loriot 1981, 230, #3: ILS 500, #5: AE 1911, 117, #6: BSAF 1898, 205, #8: CIL VIII 21559; cf. also De Ruggiero 1895, s.n. Gordianus Nepos, III 557), but the space in the lacuna would be too long for the restoration of only e.g. ἀν(ε)ικήτου. On the other hand, something like [Kaisapoc tou κυρίο]υ or [Σεβαστῶν υἰωνο]ῦ is not expected here either. It seems as if one is dealing with a new titulature for Gordian which has come down to us in an incomplete state.
- It is possible that the space before ɛ̃o]rı δέ never contained any text and that these Greek words formed part of a kind of heading.
- 10-11) These lines contained indications of the amount of taxes collected per diem of the month of Pharmuthi.


