1. Unresolved-disorganized loss and trauma and Coherence of mind scales of the Adult Attachment Interview differentiate adolescents with childhood sexual abuse from those with clinical depression and non-clinical controls over and beyond psychiatric symptoms. [\[Chapter 2, this thesis\]](#)
2. Adolescents with childhood sexual abuse show slower reaction times and higher scores (i.e. negative attention bias) for fearful and neutral faces compared to adolescents with anxiety/depressive disorders and non-clinical controls. [\[Chapter 3, this thesis\]](#)
3. Adolescents with unresolved-disorganized attachment show smaller left hippocampal volume with resting state functional connectivity differences in the limbic brain networks, regardless of a General Psychopathology Factor. [\[Chapter 4, this thesis\]](#)
4. Reduced integrity in white matter is independently associated with both unresolved-disorganized attachment and a General Psychopathology Factor. [\[Chapter 5, this thesis\]](#)
5. In rest, adolescents with unresolved-disorganized attachment show greater functional connectivity between the left amygdala and brain areas involved with resting consciousness, mental imagery, modeling people's views, spatial orientation, dissociation, depersonalization, and derealization. [\[Chapter 6, this thesis\]](#)
6. In rest, adolescents with unresolved-disorganized attachment show less left amygdala-medial frontal cortex connectivity involved with cortical control, regardless of a General Psychopathology Factor. [\[Chapter 6, this thesis\]](#)
7. Unresolved-disorganized attachment may be a trans-diagnostic risk factor that should be taken into account in many a clinical psychiatric research project. [\[this thesis\]](#)
8. Both a categorical and a dimensional approach to attachment and psychopathology are needed in research studies, in order to interpret results adequately. [\[this thesis\]](#)

9. Unresolved-disorganized attachment is the linguistically analyzed reflection of dissociation and emotional ambiguity regarding the object of trauma. *[derived from coding according to Main, Goldwyn, & Hesse, 2003; attachment field]*
10. 'Play is the highest form of research' according to scientists involved with $E=mc^2$ and those involved with children alike. *[Albert Einstein (1879-1955); Dijkgraaf, 2019, p. 292; Bowlby (1969/1982, 1973, 1980, 1988); Ainsworth (1970/1978); attachment field]*
