Curriculum vitae

Moritz Moelle is a PhD Candidate in International Law at the Universities of Geneva and Leiden. He was also a legal intern at ITLOS (2009) and an assistant editor of the Leiden Journal of International Law (2008-2009). Part of his PhD research was based on interviews and talks with current and former staff of the UN, NATO and staff of the General Staff College and the Ministry of Defence of Germany. Prior to starting his PhD, he gained master's degrees in International and European Law and in Public International Law from the Universities of Geneva and Leiden, as well as the equivalent of the LL.B.
