Betty Litamahuputty was born in Deventer, where she also went to primary and high school. From 1982 to 1984, she was employed as a consultant at the *Dewan Maluku Deventer*, a muncipal advisory board on Moluccan affairs. In 1986 she started her studies at the Department of Languages and Cultures of Southeast Asia and Oceania (now Southeast Asian Studies) at Leiden University, obtaining her MA in 1991. From 1992 to 1996 she was a PhD-student at the Research School CNWS, Leiden University with a research project on a linguistic description of Ternate Malay. She taught Indonesian language courses at the Department of Indo-Pacific Languages at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa and several other institutes in the Netherlands. She has been involved in projects on the Javanese language at Leiden University and endangered Moluccan languages at Monash University, Melbourne. Since 2001 Betty works for the Jakarta Field Station of the Max Planck Institute for Evolutionary Anthropology in Leipzig.
