## Curriculum vitae

Sebastian Reyn was born on March 29, 1967, in Delft (The Netherlands). He graduated in 1991 from the University of Leiden in The Netherlands with a degree in history and in 1994 from the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS) in Bologna, Italy, with a degree in international relations.
