Stellingen Johan de Smedt

Over onderwerp van het proefschrift

- 1. Even if Captain Lugard had not brought them to Uganda, the Nubis would still exist; they would have become a 'new tribe' in southern Sudan.
- 2. A communal title deed for the Nubian Village in Kibera will destroy the unity of the Nubi community.
- 3. If Kibera's real population is much less than was generally thought/estimated, then possibly all slum populations are overestimated; Kibera will still be the largest slum in sub-Saharan Africa.
- 4. 'Political tribalism' pays well in Kenya and will continue in the foreseeable future.

- 5. No matter the amount of money spent on slum-upgrading programmes, there will always be slums.
- 6. The study of history may be interesting and fun, but is ultimately pointless, since we (humans) don't learn from past mistakes.
