- Placebos may be fake, but they can produce genuine psychoneurobiological effects
- 2. You do not need a placebo, nor deception, to harness placebo effects
- 3. Targeting expectancies is promising for harnessing placebo effects in clinical practice (this dissertation)
- Treatment effects on pain and other physical symptoms can be optimized by inducing expectations of positive outcomes (this dissertation)
- 5. Expectancies are learned, e.g., via verbal suggestion, conditioning, or mental imagery (this dissertation)
- 6. Words can alleviate pain, or aggravate it
- 7. Mental imagery of reduced pain can reduce subsequent pain (this dissertation)
- 8. "Imagine" (John Lennon, 1971), believe in progress
- The expected effectiveness of medication is influenced by the route of treatment administration and the targeted symptom (this dissertation)
- 10. The more you know, the better you know, how little you know
- 11. Next to expectancies, related emotions and cognitions can independently and interactively influence pain and other physical symptoms
- 12. As the band Placebo said: "Without you I'm nothing"
