The typology and formal semantics of adnominal possession

- 1. There is no universal category of 'inalienable possession'.
- Abstraction over relations is necessary for a proper cross-linguistic understanding of possessive interpretations.
- 3. The notion 'possessive classifier' is an umbrella term for various lexical items that make distinct contributions to possessive constructions.
- 4. Despite superficial similarities, even closely related languages can display very different possessive distinctions.
- 5. Humans are the most stereotypical possessors.
- 6. The importance of negative evidence is often underestimated in 'semantic' sections of descriptive grammars.
- 7. Grammaticality judgments are only valuable when contrasted with a grammatical counterpart in a minimal pair.
- 8. Lack of specification can give rise to a multiplicity of interpretations, and should therefore be checked before multiple lexical entries are postulated.
- 9. The creation of a linguistic database is impossible without a linguistic analysis.
