Introduction

On 1 April 1924 Northern Rhodesia became a British Crown Colony after the British South Africa Company was resolved. The postal authorities of Northern Rhodesia issued 74 different postage stamps and 4 different postage due stamps. After the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland (1953-1963) for a brief period separate stamps for 'Northern Rhodesia' were issued again (14 postage stamps, and six postage due stamps, in December 1963). On 24 October 1964 Northern Rhodesia became the Republic of Zambia and started to issue its own stamps.

For reference we use the Michel Catalogue: Michel Katalog Süd- und Zentralafrika 2007, pp. 669-671 for 'Nord-Rhodesien', and 703-749 for 'Sambia'. For the preceding BSAC see APH 23, for Rhodesia and Nyasaland (1953-1964) see APH 24 and for railway stamps used in (Northern) Rhodesia see APH 26. British Central Africa/Nyasaland/Malawi is covered by APH 22.

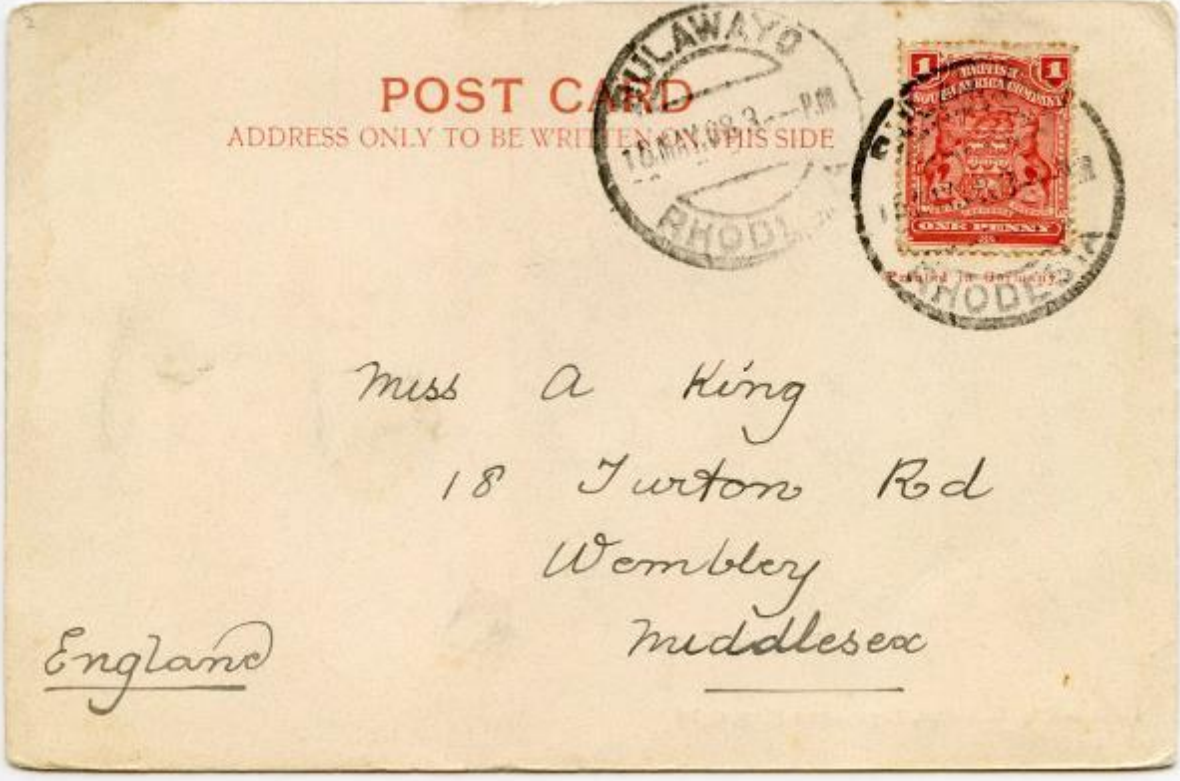

Clouston and Mrs. Betty Kirby Green flying a De Havilland Comet named 'The Burberry' from Croydon to Cape Town and back - The 14,690 mile journey was achieved in 4 days 6 hours and 25 minutes with a flying time of 77 hours 49 minutes at an average speed of 189 m.p.h. During the short stop at Broken Hill Mr. Clouston was requested to carry a number of envelopes on the remaining flight to Cape Town and to post them on arrival - Apparently Mrs. Kirby-Green was not in favour of this, as they were already under contract to an English philatelic firm to only carry a limited number of flight covers - Clouston had no such reservations and jokingly suggested that if Scott paid for their breakfast, he would take the covers, this was agreed and considered 'A Bargain'. There are four covers in total – two each addressed to G. Scott, the local wireless operator and Hoston Dubber a postal official. Rediscovered: The two covers addressed to Hoston-Dubber had most of Clouston's writing rubbed out and my belief is that someone mistook the caption 'A Bargain' as a reference to the sale price when the envelopes changed hands. They were in the collection of the late Neil Hartley sold by S. Welz in 1995".

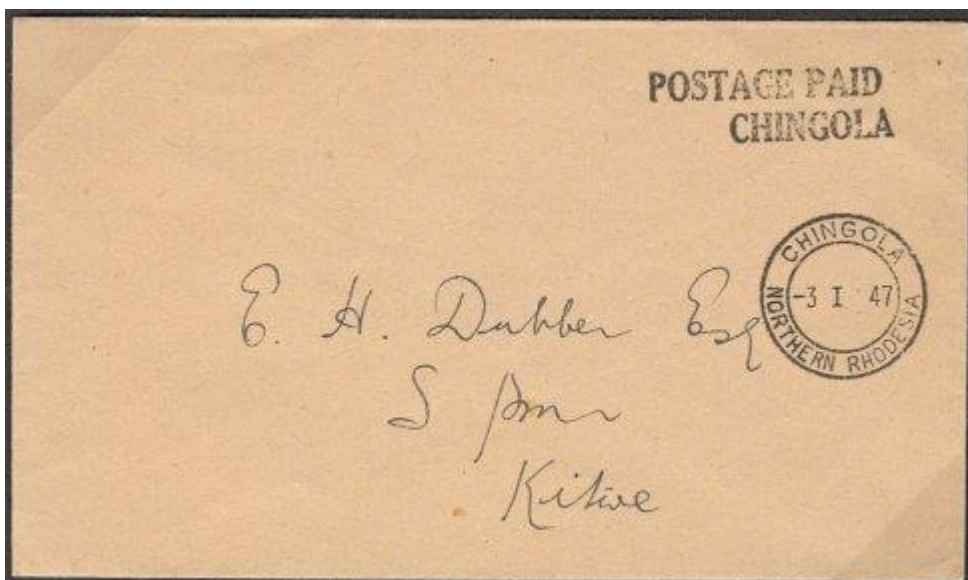

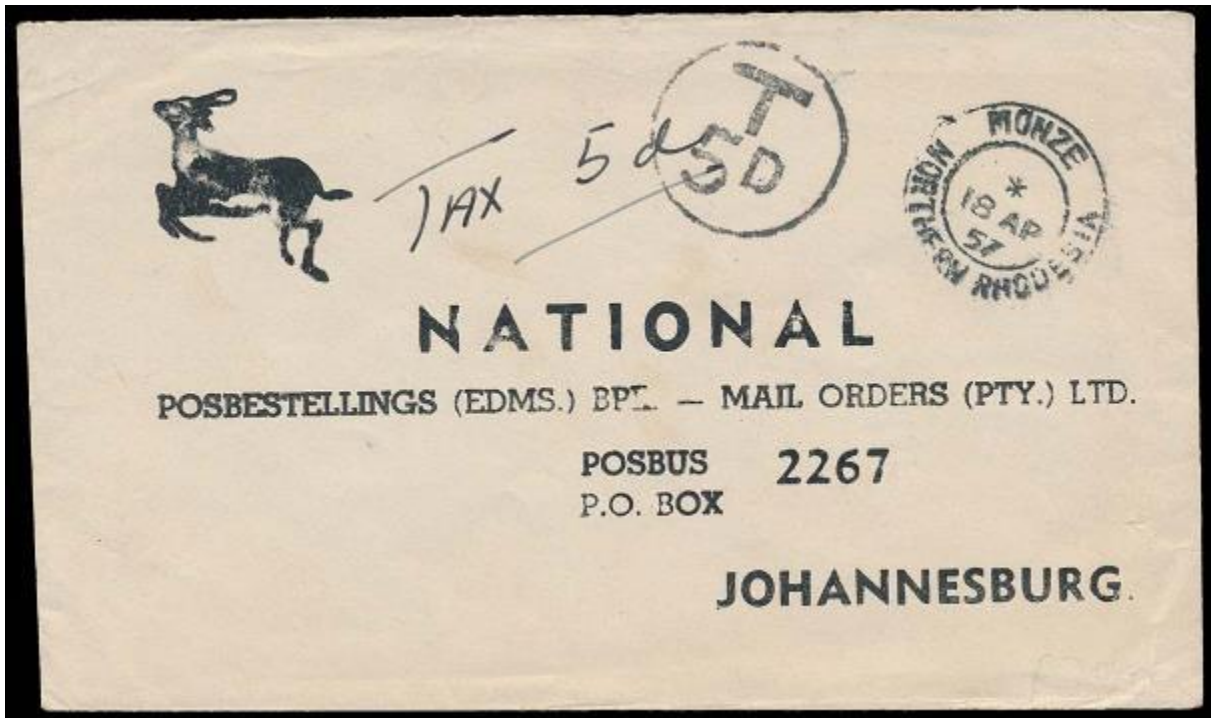

A Note on Sources:

Of all African postal heritage reconstructions, the postal area of Rhodesia (and its predecessor BSAC) is probably one of the postal territories in Africa best covered on the internet. This is the result of dedicated groups with specialised internet presence, like

www.postmarks.co.za; www.rhodesia.co.za; and www.rhodesianstamps.net; next to online catalogues (like www.stampworld.com; www.postbeeld.nl, and their free stamp catalogue, www.freestampcatalogue.nl) and internet auction resources like Ebay, Bidorbuy, and others, mentioned in the text. Stamp collectors specialised in 'Rhodesia' have an international (in fact global) organisation, registered in the UK: please see <http://www.rhodesianstudycircle.org.uk/>. We used the Michel Catalogue to indicate each type of postage stamp. Auction houses often use the Stanley Gibbons Catalogue (SG in references), or Scott.
