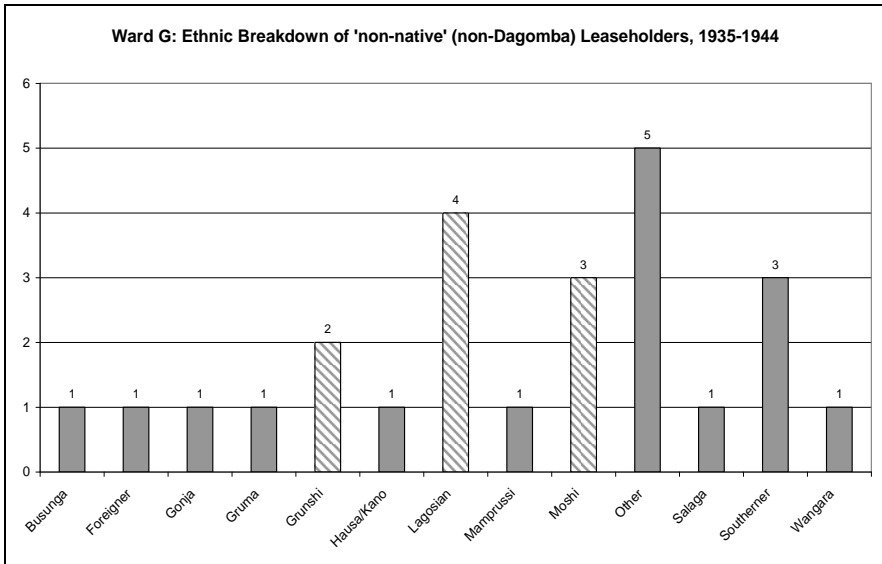
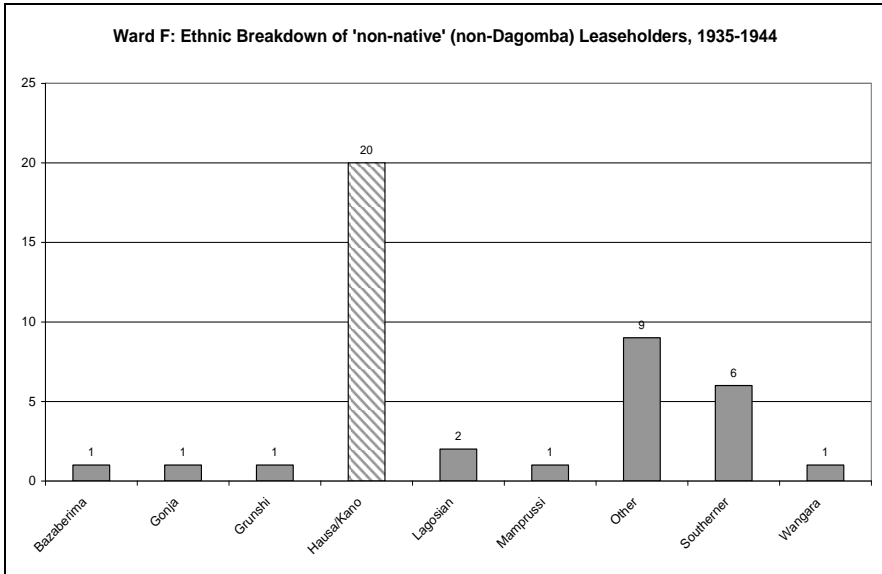
Appendix I: Non-Dagomba leaseholders by Ethnicity for respective Wards.<sup>1</sup>

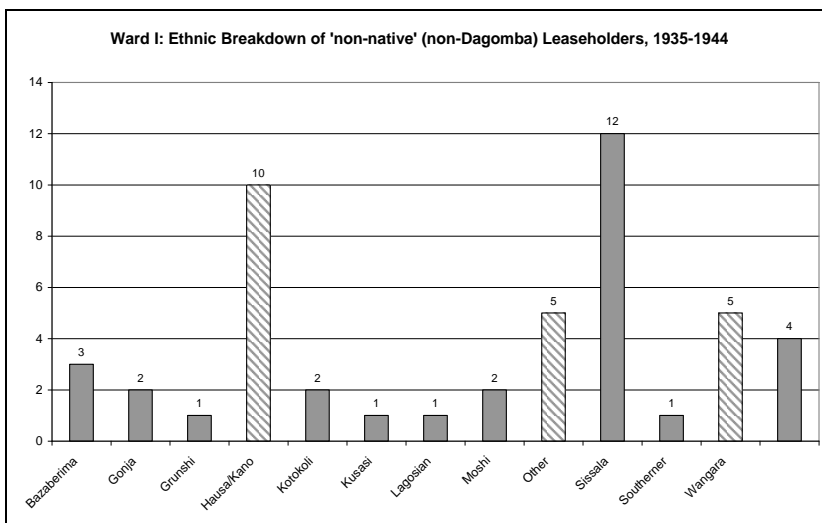
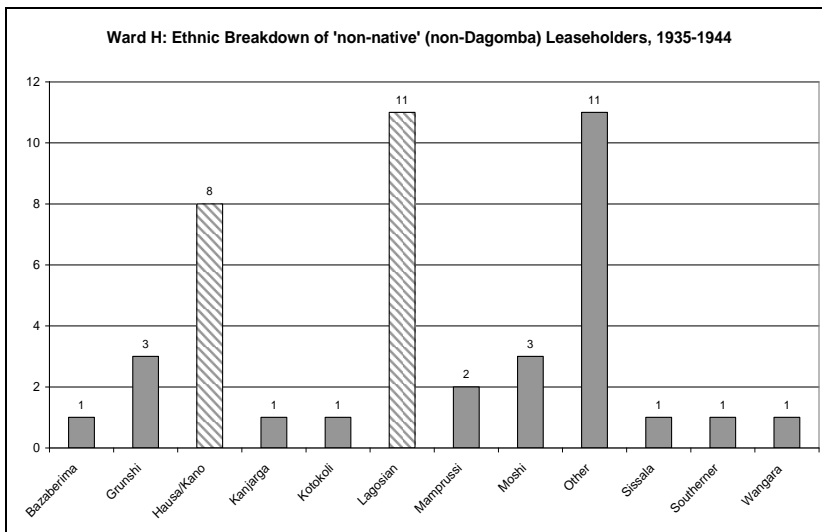
