Curriculum Vitae

DIRK MEYER

I was born in Oldenburg i. Oldb., Germany (1975). After final secondary-school examinations (Abitur) in 1994, I carried out community service at the School for the Handicapped (Kardinal-von-Galen-Haus), Dinklage, Germany (1994-1995). I moved to Taipei, Taiwan, in 1996, where I studied Classical Chinese Philology at the Chinese Department (中文系) at National Taiwan University, NTU (國立臺灣大學). In 2000, I moved to Heidelberg to study Classical Sinology and Philosophy. In 2002, I transferred to Leiden University and completed my MA in Chinese Studies in 2003. In 2004, I qualified for a four-year position as a PhD candidate at the Research School CNWS, Leiden University, which enabled me to research the palaeographic materials from tomb Guōdiàn One. In 2007, I submitted my thesis one year ahead of time and took up the newly established position for Chinese Philosophy at the University of Oxford.
