Appendix III: Catalogue of epigraphic record for British auxiliary and *numeri* units

This appendix I encompasses all diplomas and inscriptions which have been reported to the time of the publishing. The catalogue is divided into the two parts:

1. Military diplomas and inscriptions that record the positions only of British units in various Roman provinces. The entries in this part of the catalogue are divided by a unit, followed by the division on the type of sources, where military diplomas come first followed by inscriptions. The units are arranged first according to their status, i.e. alae preceding cohorts, then according to their numeral. If two or more units have a similar name and / or the same numeral, they were arranged alphabetically, i.e. units with title *I Britannica* precede those with the title *I Brittonum*. Military diplomas and inscriptions, when possible, were arranged chronologically. If more than one diploma mentioning a British unit was issued in a particular year, all documents were mentioned together; the editing was taken from the first cited diploma.
2. Inscriptions mentioning the *numeri Brittones* in Germany and military diplomas and inscriptions recording the presence of the *numerus singularium Britannicorum* in Dacia. The entries in this part are divided by units name, arranged alphabetically. Military diplomas and inscriptions, when possible, were arranged chronologically.

The information for each entry is given in the following order (layout after Rothe 2009, 119). Where data is unknown, it is recorded as ‘-’.

Military diplomas entries

Concordance: This cites the catalogue numbers of the diplomas in the various corpora.

Provenance: The diplomas were arranged according to the places where they were found. The names of the places are given, when known, in Roman and modern names, in this exact order.

Text: The text of each diploma does not appear here fully. Only the following information was included, such as those relating to the dating of a document, i.e. the reign of an Emperor, consuls years, the location of a unit in a province, the recipient of a diploma if he served in a mentioned British unit and other relevant information.

Date: The diplomas were dated according to the information provided on diploma itself.

Literature: All known literature mentioning a particular diploma is given. When the diploma has appeared in another catalogue with full list of literature, the reader is referred to that work.

Inscription entries

Concordance: This sites the catalogue numbers of the diplomas in the various corpora.

Provenance: The inscriptions were arranged according to the places where they were found. The names of the places are given, when known, in Roman and modern names, in this exact order.

Present location: When possible, includes the name of the museum, followed by inventory number.

Stone type: S stands for sandstone; L for limestone; M for marble.

Measurements: The measurements of a stone or fragment of the stone are given as they appear today. The measurements are given: breadth / height / thickness in centimeters.

Stone description: Only the stones with depictions have been described and only sections of the stone from where the most information can be derived. Note: not every flower or decoration is mentioned. The description follows the layout of the stone starting from the gable, followed by the main picture and describes only the most significant features.

Inscription: The editing is generally taken from the most recent literature.

Translation of an inscription: Inscriptions have been translated by me with the help from Dr L. B. van der Meer, University of Leiden, The Netherlands, and, in some cases, the translations were given as they appeared in the various corpora. Moreover, the general books on reading and understanding of Roman inscriptions have been used (Keppie 2001; Harvey 2004; Rogan 2006).

Date: Some inscriptions were dated according to the epigraphic formulae. There were cases where the inscriptions can be dated precisely. Where there is disagreement as to the dating, the different suggestions are put forward followed by references. Some inscriptions were impossible to date due to the preservation.

Literature: All known literature mentioning a particular inscription is given. When the inscription has appeared in another catalogue with full list of literature, the reader is referred to that work.

Appendix IV: Catalogue of Britons abroad

This appendix encompasses military diplomas and inscriptions which record the service of Britons in legions and other than British auxiliary units, and British civilians. The entries of this part of the catalogue are arranged respectively, i.e. starting with the military and ending with civilian Britons, military diplomas preceding the inscriptions. Military inscriptions are arranged first according to the status of the soldiers, (legionaries, troopers in the Imperial horse guard in Rome, auxiliaries and mariners), then chronologically. Civilian inscriptions are divided first on those erected by civilian with unknown occupation and freedmen, then - those erected by traders. When possible, diplomas and inscriptions were arranged chronologically.

Appendix VI: Catalogue of British-made brooches overseas

This catalogue encompasses British-made brooches which have been reported from the sites in the Continental Europe. The entries in the catalogue are divided by the Roman provinces, followed by the division on the types. The choice, which type comes first, depends on the frequency this type has been recorded in a particular province. The catalogue is based on the initial dataset, which was compiled by Francis Morris from the University of Oxford; it comprises 179 brooches from 77 sites across Europe (Morris 2010, Appendix 6). As such, some of the brooches have been omitted in the present catalogue, since in some cases the brooches, mentioned by Morris, were not identified in the original publications. In summary, to the present date 242 British-made brooches have been found on 102 sites across the Empire; the provenance of 19 brooches was recorded as unknown.

The information for each entry is given in the following order (layout after Rothe 2009, 119). Where data is unknown, it is recorded as ‘-’.

Provenance: the brooches were arranged according to the places where they were found. The names of the places are given, when known, in Roman and modern names, in this exact order. When the exact find spot was known, it has been recorded as well.

Present location: includes the name of the museum, followed by inventory number.

State of preservation: This is not intended as a comprehensive description of the brooch, but only refers to the state of preservation (fully or partially). When the brooch has been only partially preserved, what is missing has been recorded.

Measurements: of the brooch or fragment, as it appears in the excavation reports. The measurements are given in height in centimeters. In the case of the oval brooches, the diameter is indicated.

Brooch type: the typology is according to Hull's description as referred to in Bayley and Butcher (2004, 230-240). Only two types, referred to as T157 and T158 in Hull's, in the present thesis referred to as trumpet 2A (decorated brooches with acanthus moulding) and trumpet 2b (not enameled brooches) according to Böhme (1970) classification.

Date: the dating of the brooches is based on evidence from sites: where the context was known and datable, the relative time span of the brooch's use and its appearance on the site, i.e. the *terminus ante quem*, was established. Where the context was not recorded in a publication, the dating was based on the general knowledge of the occurrence of a type. It should be emphasized that some of the brooches were used longer than others, which can be determined by the state of a brooch (signs of extensive wear or repairs).

Literature: All known literature mentioning the brooch is given. When the brooch has appeared in another catalogue with full list of literature, the reader is referred to that work.
