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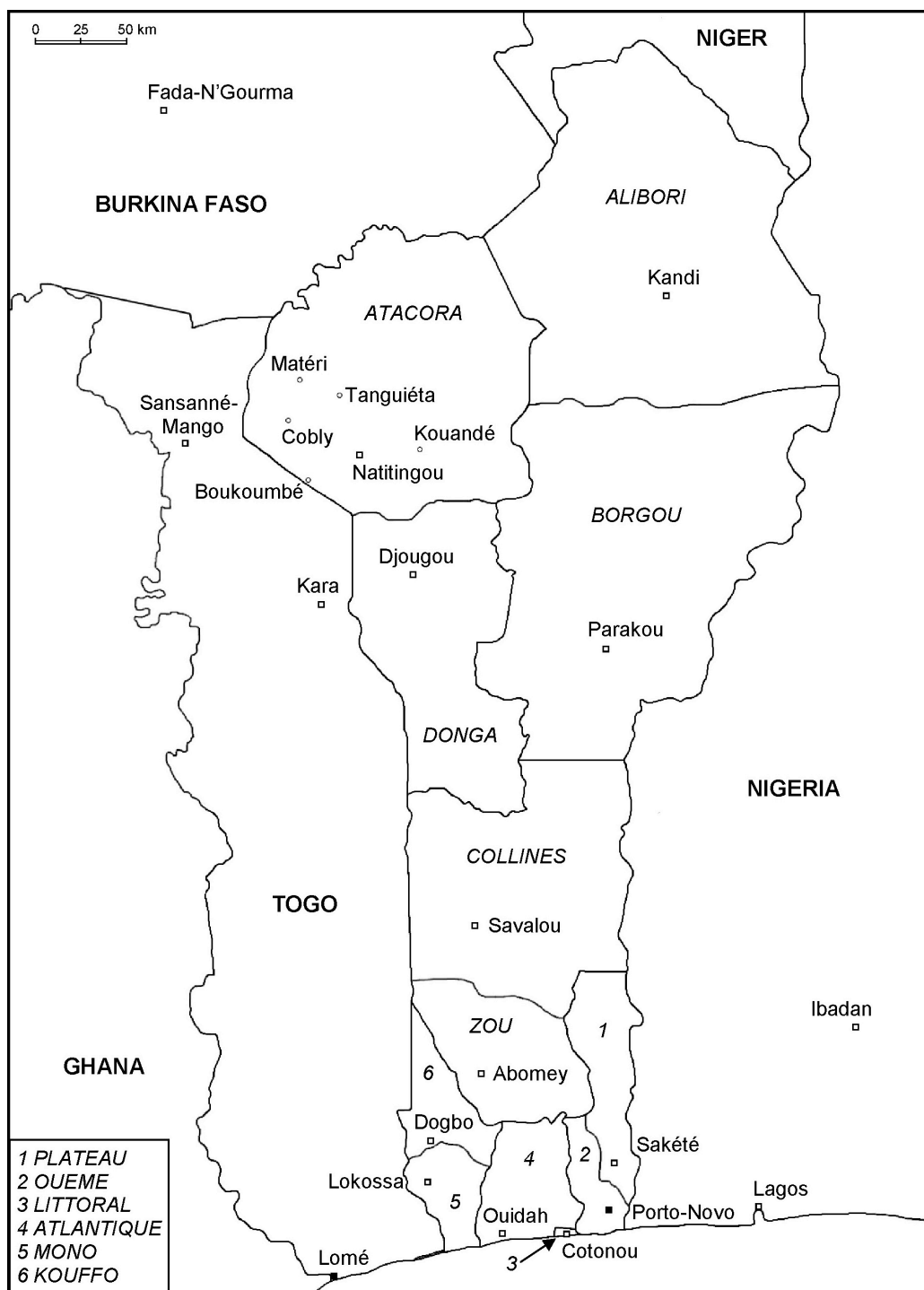
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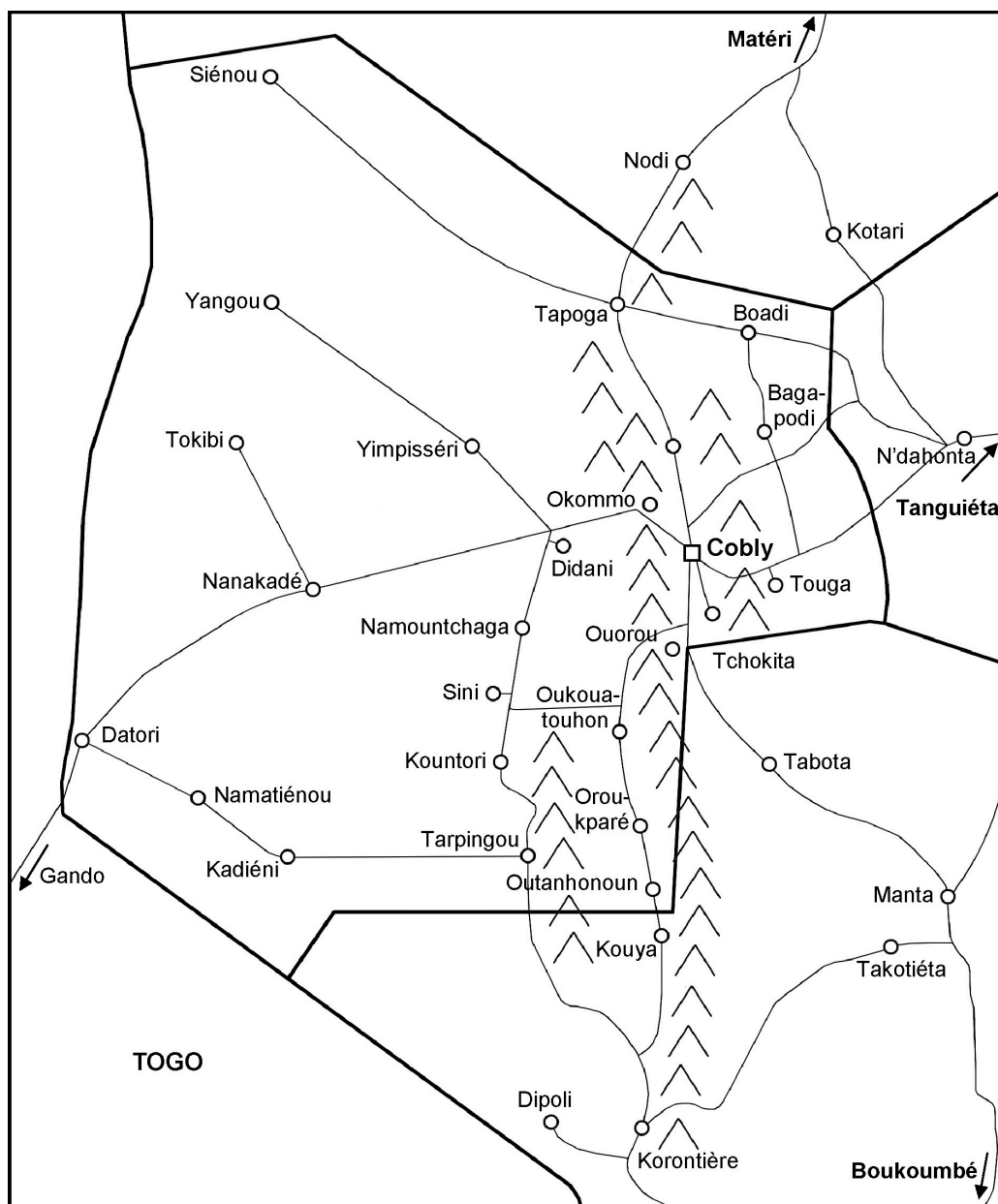
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Map 1: The Republic of Benin with surrounding areas.
