Matthias Pache was born on March 19, 1983, in Cologne, Germany. He obtained a *maîtrise* in Contemporanean Societies: Europe–Americas at Université Paris III Sorbonne Nouvelle (2006), a Master’s degree (*Magister*) in Anthropology of the Americas in 2007, and, in 2009, a Master’s degree (*Diplom*) in Psychology. From 2004 to 2007, his studies in Anthropology of the Americas were financed by the German National Science foundation. Between 2009 and 2012, he taught Mapudungun and Aymara at the University of Bonn and worked as a school psychologist. In January 2013, he joined Willem Adelaar’s ERC research project “The Linguistic Past of Mesoamerica and the Andes”. From October 2017 to October 2018, he was appointed to a research project at the Institute for Anthropology of the Americas at the University of Bonn, directed by Karoline Noack and Beatrix Hoffmann-Ihde. As of December 2018, he has an appointment in a research project at the Linguistics Department of the University of Tübingen, directed by Matthias Urban. Since 2004, Matthias Pache has undertaken several fieldwork trips to South America. He has published several linguistic papers dealing with Native American languages, both of the Andes (e.g., Quechuan, Aymaran, Mapudungun, Lengua X) and of the Intermediate Area (e.g., Chibchan, Pumé, Chocoan).
