Curriculum Vitae

Cameron Gill (Basseterre, St. Kitts 1969) completed a BA degree (with Honours) in History with a Minor in Archaeology at the University of the West Indies, Cave Hill Campus in 2003. From 2003 to 2007 he taught History and Agricultural Science at the Charlestown Secondary School in Nevis. During this time he participated in archaeological excavations with Roger Leech of University of London at Pinneys and Montravers Estates, and with Marco Meniketti of San José State University at Bush Hill Estate. He also conducted archaeological surveys of the Box Cottage in Charlestown and the Combermere Library.

In 2007 Cameron returned to the UWI, Cave Hill to pursue an MA in Heritage Studies. In 2009 he received his Masters with Distinction. For his Master's thesis he researched the maritime heritage of Barbados from a material culture perspective, including comparisons with several Anglophone, Francophone and Dutch Caribbean islands.

From 2010 to 2016 Cameron served as the General Manager of the Brimstone Hill Fortress National Park Society and the UNESCO Focal Point for St. Kitts and Nevis. During this period he directed and successfully completed several major restoration projects at the Brimstone Hill Fortress (a UNESCO World Heritage Site). These include: restoration of the eighteenth century limekiln, one of the largest known existing vertical limekilns in the Americas; restoration of several casemates at the Fort George Citadel; and restoration of the Infantry Officers Quarters. Cameron also initiated the rehabilitation of two of St. Kitts' other important historic fortifications, Charles Fort, which is the sister fortification of Brimstone Hill and Fort Thomas in Basseterre.

As part of investigations into why one of the smallest and lesser known towns in the Caribbean is also one of the most heavily fortified, from 2012 to 2015 Cameron directed an extensive terrestrial and underwater archaeological survey of the port of Sandy Point and its anchorage. Conducted by The Foundation for Maritime Archaeology in Curacao (STIMACUR), the survey comprised the archaeological fieldwork component of his doctoral research at Leiden University. Cameron is also the Principal Archaeologist and Heritage Consultant at C. Gill Consulting. As an independent consultant he has been involved in the training of park rangers for St. Kitts and Nevis' Rainforest Reserves, and the creation of the sugar industry museum at the St. Kitts Eco Park, one of the largest industrial heritage museums in the Eastern Caribbean. Cameron presently teaches History and Social Studies at a private Catholic School on St. Kitts and is an Adjunct Lecturer at the Clarence Fitzroy Bryant College.
