The ascetic Avalokiteśvara: the earliest Avalokiteśvara in Java?

1. Two-armed standing ascetic Avalokiteśvara

Find place: Java, Indonesia.

Current location: Musée national Français d'arts asiatiques - Guimet, Paris, France. MG 3620.

Material: Bronze with a yellow and green patina.

Date: 600-700 CE.

Height: 17 cm.

Position: Standing with the main body weight on the left leg causing the left hip to jut out to the Bodhisattva's left.

Number of arms: Two.

Attributes and hand gestures: The right arm is broken above the elbow and the left hand holds a small flask.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: The Bodhisattva has a cornet-shaped hairdo with a rounded top and the front is taken up almost entirely by the Buddha Amitābha. Avalokiteśvara also has a simple diadem.

Yajñopavīta: Not present.

Dress: No visible pattern.

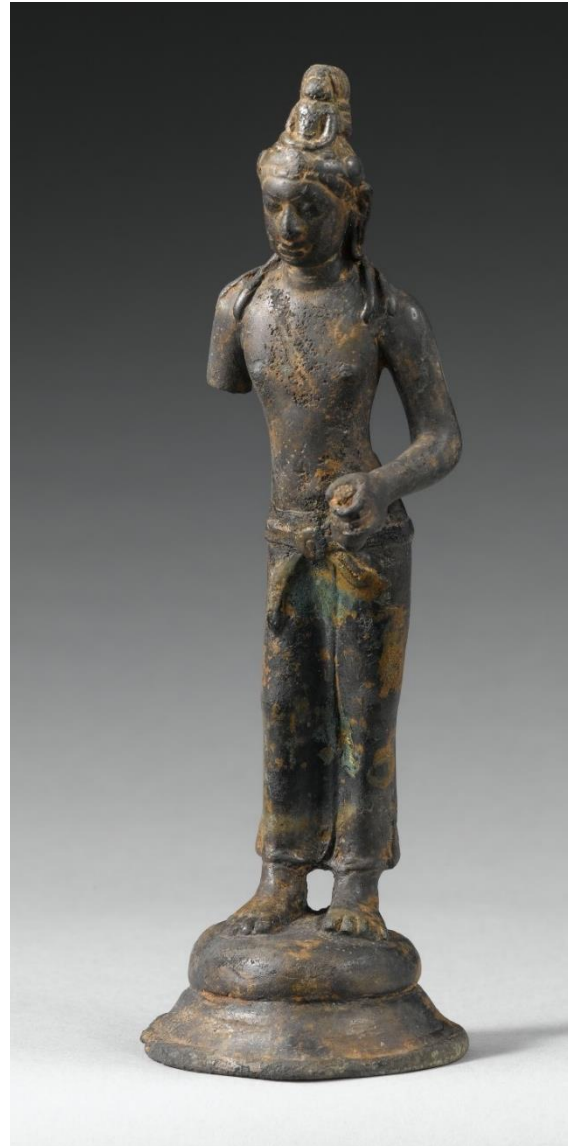
Belt: Simple ribbon tied in a knot.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: None.

Base: Stands on a round cushion, possibly a lotus with a bell-shaped base.

2. Two-armed standing ascetic Avalokiteśvara

Find place: Sumatra, Indonesia.

Current location: The Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, United States of America. 1987.142.223.

Material: Bronze.

Date: 600-700 CE.

Height: 13 cm.

Position: Standing with the left hip jutting out slightly to the Bodhisattva's left.

Number of arms: Two.

Attributes and hand gestures: Both lower arms are damaged and no attributes remain.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: Simple diadem. The Bodhisattva has a cornet shaped hairdo with a flat top. The front of the hairdo is almost entirely taken up by the Buddha Amitābha.

Yajñopavīta: Not present.

Dress: The end of the lower garment is pulled up over the waist band.

Belt: Simple ribbon tied in a knot.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: None.

Base: The Bodhisattva stands on a round cushion, possibly a lotus with a bell-shaped base.

3. Two-armed standing ascetic Avalokiteśvara

Find place: Cambodia.

Current location: National Museum of Cambodia, Phnom Penh, Cambodia. Ga3453.

Material: Bronze.

Date: 600-700 CE.

Height: 18 cm.

Position: Standing in *samapāda*.

Number of arms: Two.

Attributes and hand gestures: The right hand is held open and may once have held a lotus stem. The left hand holds a water vessel.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: The Bodhisattva has a bun-shaped hairdo with the Buddha Amitābha at the front.

Yajñopavīta: None.

Dress: The lower garment is plain and has a slight flounce at the hem.

Belt: There appears to be a broad belt over the lower garment.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: None.

Base: None.

Other: This type of hairdo is also seen on Avalokiteśvara bronzes from the Central Javanese period.

Material: Bronze.

Date: 600-700 CE.

Height: 8.5 cm.

Position: Standing in *samapāda*.

Number of arms: Two.

Attributes and hand gestures: Unknown, the right arm is broken below the elbow and the left arm at the elbow.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: Triangular-shaped hairdo with a rounded top and the Buddha Amitābha takes up most of the space in front of the *jaṭāmukuta*.

Yajñopavīta: None.

Dress: Lower garment with a herringbone pattern created by pulling the central part of the garment up and over the waist band.

Belt: Simple tie.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: None.

Base: None.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: Triangular hairdo with a rounded top. There is an outline of the Buddha Amitābha at the front of the hairdo.

Yajñopavīta: None.

Dress: A plain lower garment with a fold down the centre. There may be a tiger skin tied around the hips, but it is uncertain due to the metal wear.

Belt: No specific belt visible.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: None.

Yajñopavīta: None.

Dress: A plain lower garment with a centre part pulled up over the waistband to create a herringbone pattern in the fabric.

Belt: No specific belt visible.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: None.

Yajñopavīta: None.

Dress: A plain lower garment with the centre part pulled up over the waistband to create a herringbone pattern in the fabric.

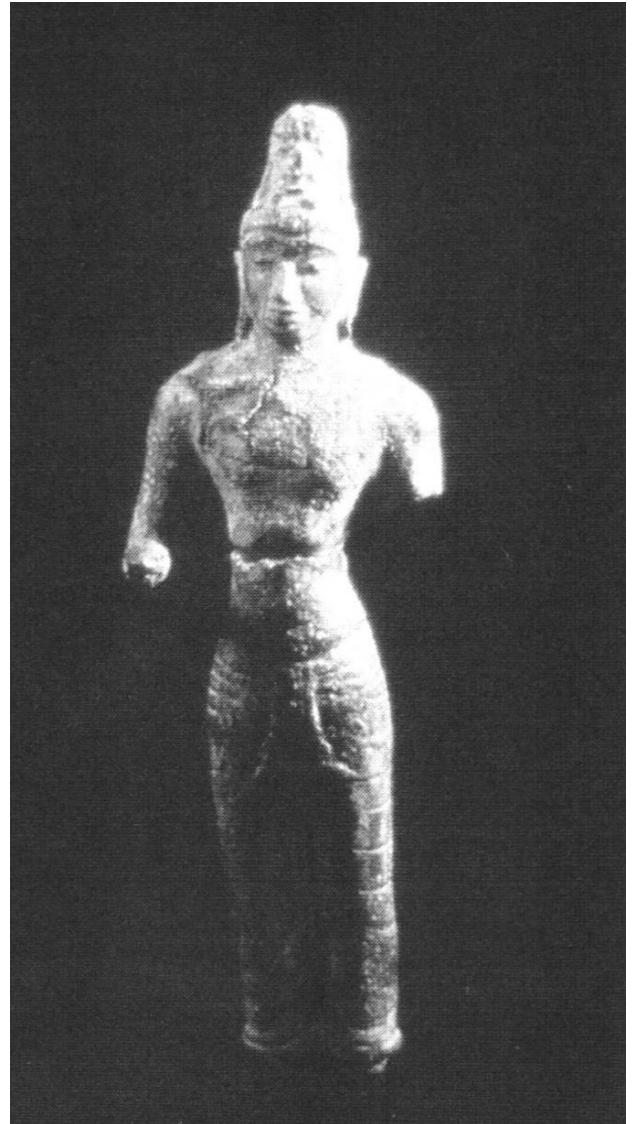
Belt: No specific belt visible.

9. Four-armed standing ascetic Avalokiteśvara

Find place: Found on the grounds of an ancient monastery in Nakhon Pathom Province, Peninsular Thailand.

Current location: Bangkok National Museum, Bangkok, Thailand since 1955. (Acc. no. not given).

Material: Bronze.

Date: 600-700 CE.

Height: Approximately 14 cm.

Position: Standing with the right hip jutting out to the right side.

Number of arms: Four.

Attributes and hand gestures: Unknown, as arms are partly missing.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: Rounded bun-shaped hairdo with the Buddha Amitābha in front.

Yajñopavīta: None.

Dress: A plain lower garment with a centre part pulled up over the waistband to create a herringbone pattern in the fabric.

Belt: No specific belt visible. There may be a tiger skin around the hips based on the silhouette of the figure.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: None.

Base: Round flat base.

10. Four-armed standing ascetic Avalokiteśvara

Find place: Believed to have been found as part of a hoard at Plai Bat Hill in northeastern Thailand.

Current location: Asian Art Museum, San Francisco, United States of America. B65B58.

Material: Solid cast, high tin leaded bronze.

Date: 600-800 CE.

Height: 21.6 cm.

Position: Standing in *samapāda*.

Number of arms: Four.

Attributes and hand gestures: The upper right hand holds a rosary and the lower right hand a lotus in bud form. The upper left hand holds a book and the lower left hand a water vessel.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: The Bodhisattva has a broad cornet-shaped hairdo with the front taken up almost entirely by the Buddha Amitābha.

Yajñopavīta: None.

Dress: The end of the lower garment is pulled up over the waist band creating a herringbone pattern in the fabric.

Belt: Simple ribbon tied into a rosette at the front.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: None.

Base: None.

11. Two-armed standing ascetic Avalokiteśvara

Find place: Nakhon Pathom, Peninsular Thailand.

Current location: Unknown.

Material: Bronze.

Date: 600-700 CE.

Height: 17 cm.

Position: Standing in *samapāda*.

Number of arms: Two.

Attributes and hand gestures: Unknown, arms are broken above the elbows.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: Tall bun-shaped hairdo with a rounded top and the Buddha Amitābha depicted at the front.

Yajñopavīta: None.

Dress: A plain lower garment with the centre part pulled up over the waistband to create a herringbone pattern in the fabric.

Belt: No specific belt visible.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: None.

Base: The Bodhisattva stands on a round pedestal, possibly a lotus with a bell-shaped base, which is similar to the bases seen in Cat. nos 1-2.

Other: This statuette is more stylised in its design of both the lower garment and the hairdo than we have seen in the previous ascetic Avalokiteśvara images (Cat. nos 5-9). This could be due to a lack of wear of the

statuette, or it could have been made at a later date.

12. Three clay tablets with Buddhist triads from Peninsular Thailand

Find place: Peninsular Thailand.

Current location: National Museum, Bangkok, Thailand. (Acc. no. not given).

Material: Clay.

Date: 600-700 CE.

Height: Approximately 8-10 cm.

Position: The Bodhisattva identified as Avalokiteśvara stands with his left hip jutting out towards the seated Buddha. Above the triad are three seated Buddha figures.

Number of arms: Two.

Attributes and hand gestures: The right hand may hold a water vessel and the left hand appears to be displaying the *vitarka-mudrā*.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: Cone-shaped hairdo with a flat top. Due to the wear of the clay no Buddha Amitābha figure can be determined.

Yajñopavīta: None.

Dress: A plain lower garment is wrapped around the hips and legs.

Belt: No specific belt visible.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: None.

Base: Stands on a round lotus base.

Published: Similar tablets have been published by Krairiksh 2012: 84. Image taken by author at the National Museum in Bangkok.



13. Two clay tablets with a Buddhist triad from West Java

Find place: Blandongan Temple, Batujaya, West Java, Indonesia.

Current location: Unknown.

Material: Clay.

Date: 600-700 CE.

Height: Approximately 25-30 cm.

Position: The Bodhisattva identified as Avalokiteśvara stands with his left hip jutting out to the left. The Bodhisattva stands to the seated Buddha's right. Above the triad are three seated Buddha figures.

Number of arms: Two.

Attributes and hand gestures: The right hand appears to hold a water vessel. The left

hand appears to be displaying the *vitarka-mudrā* or possibly holding another attribute.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: Cone shaped hairdo with a flat top. Due to the wear of the clay no Buddha Amitābha figure can be made out.

Yajñopavīta: None.

Dress: A plain lower garment wrapped around the hips and legs.

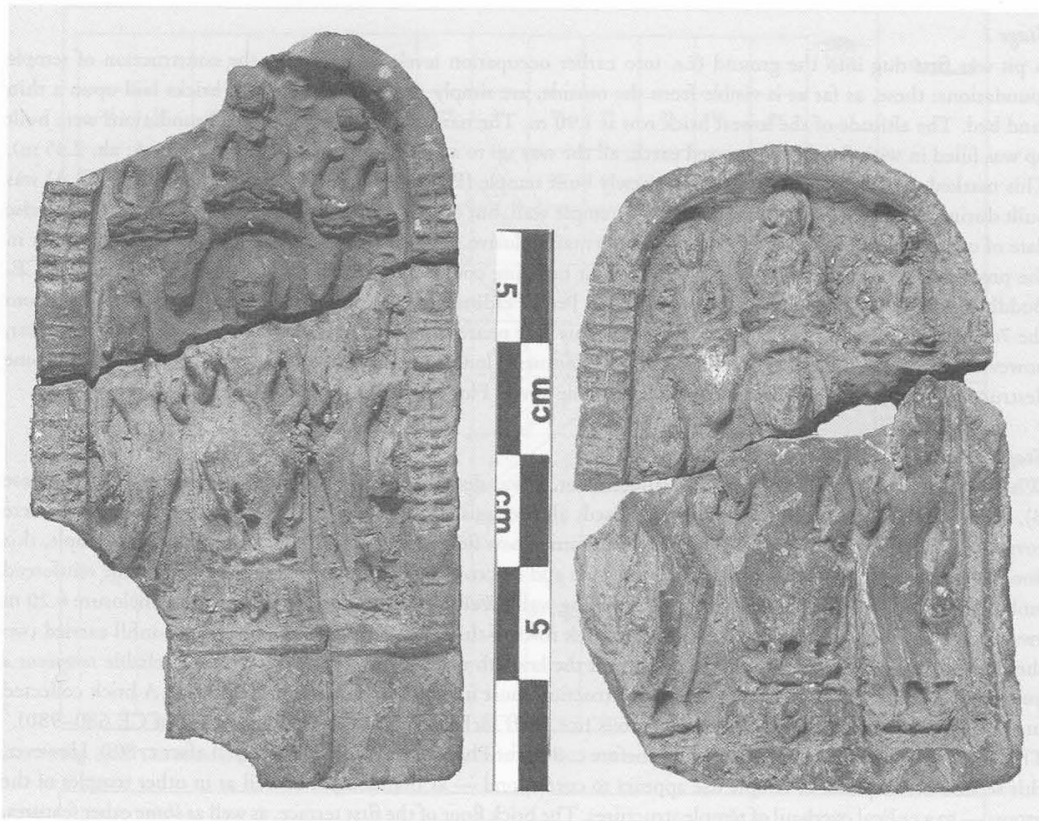
Belt: No specific belt visible.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: None.

Base: Stands on a round lotus base.

Published: Manguin and Indrajaya 2006: 250.



14. Two-armed standing Avalokiteśvara with an inscription on the back of the base

Find place: Gunung Kidul, Yogyakarta, Java, Indonesia.

Current location: Museum Nasional Indonesia, Jakarta, Java, Indonesia. A28.

Material: Gilded bronze.

Date: 700-800 CE.

Height: Approximately 16 cm.

Position: Avalokiteśvara stands with his right hip jutting out to the right.

Number of arms: Two.

Attributes and hand gestures: The right hand displays the *varada-mudrā* and the left hand holds a lotus. We can see the flower by the left shoulder.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: Bun-shaped hairdo with the Buddha Amitābha seated on the scalp in front of the hairdo.

Yajñopavīta: Part of the lower garment lies over the left shoulder creating a sacred thread.

Dress: A plain lower garment wrapped around the hips and legs.

Belt: No specific belt visible.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: The back piece is open-worked with a plain frame that has a pearl décor and flames at intervals along the outside. The top of the back piece has a triangular shaped floral piece. Behind the Bodhisattva are flowers connecting the sides of the *prabhāmaṇḍala*.

Base: Stands on a round lotus resting on a square base.

Other: This type of back piece was illustrated in Bernet Kempers' *The bronzes of Nalanda and Hindu-Javanese art* (1931). The inscription is the 'ye dharma'-stanza in the Siddhamāṭṛkā script (Personal correspondence with Prof. A. Griffiths 5-12-2012).

15. Four-armed standing Avalokiteśvara

Find place: Borobudur *stūpa*, Central Java, Indonesia.

Current location: Museum Volkenkunde, Leiden, the Netherlands. RV-1403-1841.

Material: Silver.

Date: 650-800 CE.

Height: 15.4 cm.

Position: Standing in *samapāda*.

Number of arms: Four.

Attributes and hand gestures: The attribute in the top right hand is damaged but from what remains it is possible that the hand held a three-pronged staff or a rosary. The lower right hand is in *varada-mudrā*. The upper left hand holds a book and the lower left a lotus.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: Simple diadem. Thin tower-shaped hairdo with the Buddha Amitābha at the front.

Yajñopavīta: Broad sash that doubles in width by the waist.

Dress: Unadorned lower garment. Folded in the middle with clear separation between the legs. There is also a tiger skin wrapped around the hips with the tiger's face looking towards the left.

Belt: Square shaped buckle.

Jewellery: None.

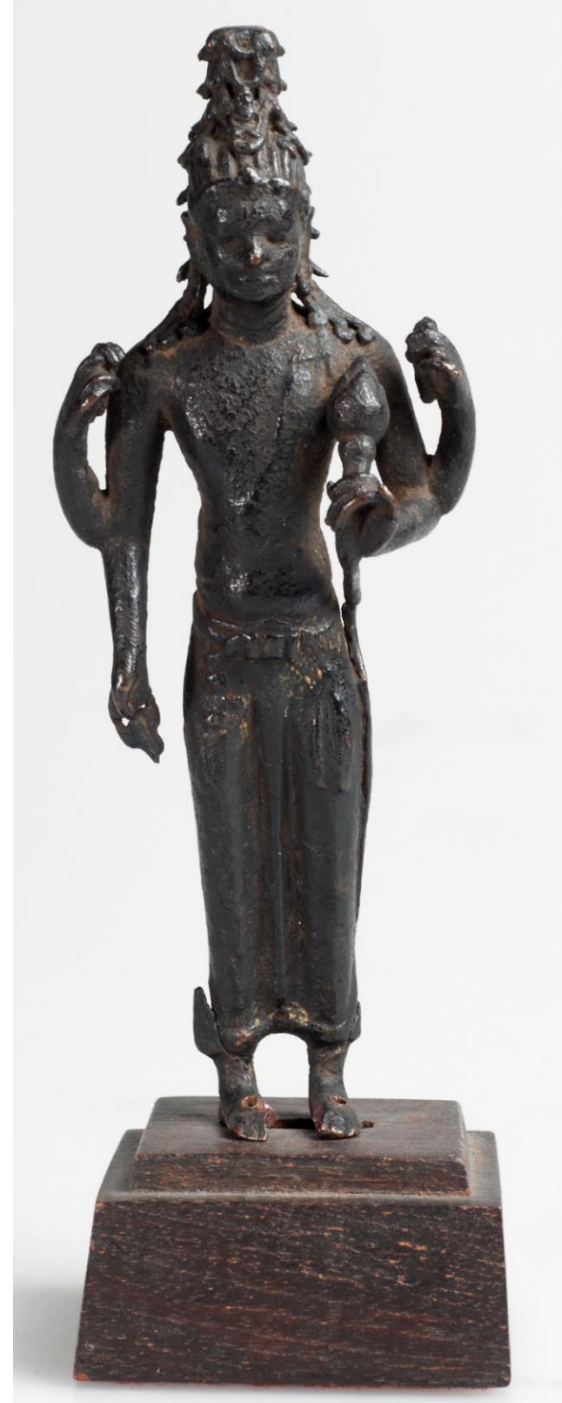
Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: There are two small holes on the back of the statuette that could have supported a thin rimmed halo (Lunsingh Scheurleer and Klokke 1988: 59).

Base: None.

Other: Feet and lower part of the dress have been restored (Lunsingh Scheurleer and Klokke

1988: 59). This image was discovered in 1842 in the top of the Borobudur stupa along with RMV 1403-1842 and 1403-1843, which was opened by Hartman, the Resident of Kedu in Central Java.

Material: Silver.

Date: 650-750 CE.

Height: 10.5 cm.

Position: Standing with the right hip jutting out to the right.

Number of arms: Four.

Attributes and hand gestures: The top right hand appears to hold a rosary connected to the halo and the lower right hand displays the *varada-mudrā*. The upper left hand holds a book. The lowermost left hand holds a stem, likely that of a lotus. Part of the stem is also visible by the left knee.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: Simple diadem. Tower-shaped hairdo with cascading hair over the shoulders and the Buddha Amitābha figure at the front.

Yajñopavīta: Sash with a loop at the top left shoulder.

Dress: Lower garment is decorated with double lines.

Belt: Rope like belt tied into a rosette.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: Plain rim halo attached to the back of the figure.

Base: The base is believed to be a recent reconstruction.

Other: Possible statuette was created in the 1800s due to its base.



17. Four-armed standing Avalokiteśvara

Find place: Sambas, West Kalimantan, Indonesia.

Current location: British Museum, London, United Kingdom. 1956,0725.9.

Material: Silver and bronze.

Date: 650-800 CE.

Height: 13.6 cm.

Position: Standing in *samapāda*.

Number of arms: Four.

Attributes and hand gestures: The upper right hand holds a book and the lower right hand displays the *varada-mudrā*. The upper left hand appears to hold a three-pronged staff and the lower left hand holds a lotus with a long stem that ran along the left leg.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: Simple diadem. Tower-shaped hairdo with the Buddha Amitābha at the front.

Yajñopavīta: Sash widening at the waist.

Dress: The lower garment has a double line pattern and a fabric fold between the legs. A tiger skin is tied below the belt with the head facing to the left and on the left thigh we can see the tail of the tiger.

Belt: The belt is fastened in three steps, with a rectangular-shaped buckle.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: None.

Base: Stands on a pod emerging from a round double lotus.

Other: Part of the Sambas Hoard now at the British Museum.

18. Four-armed standing Avalokiteśvara

Position: Standing in *samapāda*.

Number of arms: Four.

Attributes and hand gestures: The upper right hand is damaged and likely holds a rosary and the lower right hand is slightly damaged but appears to be displaying the *varada-mudrā*. The upper left hand holds a book and the lower left hand holds a stem of what was most likely a lotus.

Jaṭāmukuta and hair: Simple diadem. Bun-shaped hairdo with the Buddha Amitābha at the front.

Yajñopavīta: Ribbon with a tie at the shoulder.

Dress: Central fold in the lower garment with a tiger skin wrapped around the hips. The head of the tiger is facing downwards on the left leg.

Belt: Belt with a floral shaped buckle and the belt connects with the tiger skin.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: None.

Dress: Lines on the lower garment create a herringbone pattern, which ends at the hem in a swallow's tail silhouette.

Belt: Appears to be a rope-shaped belt hanging down in front.

Jewellery: None.

Prabhāmaṇḍala and halo: None.

Base: None.

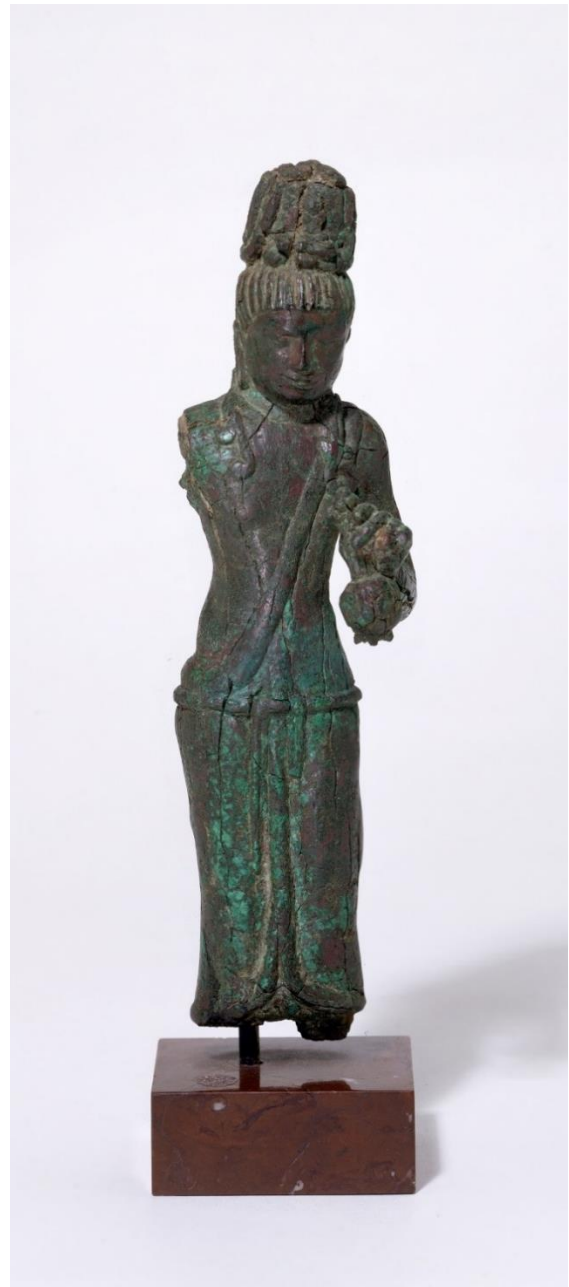

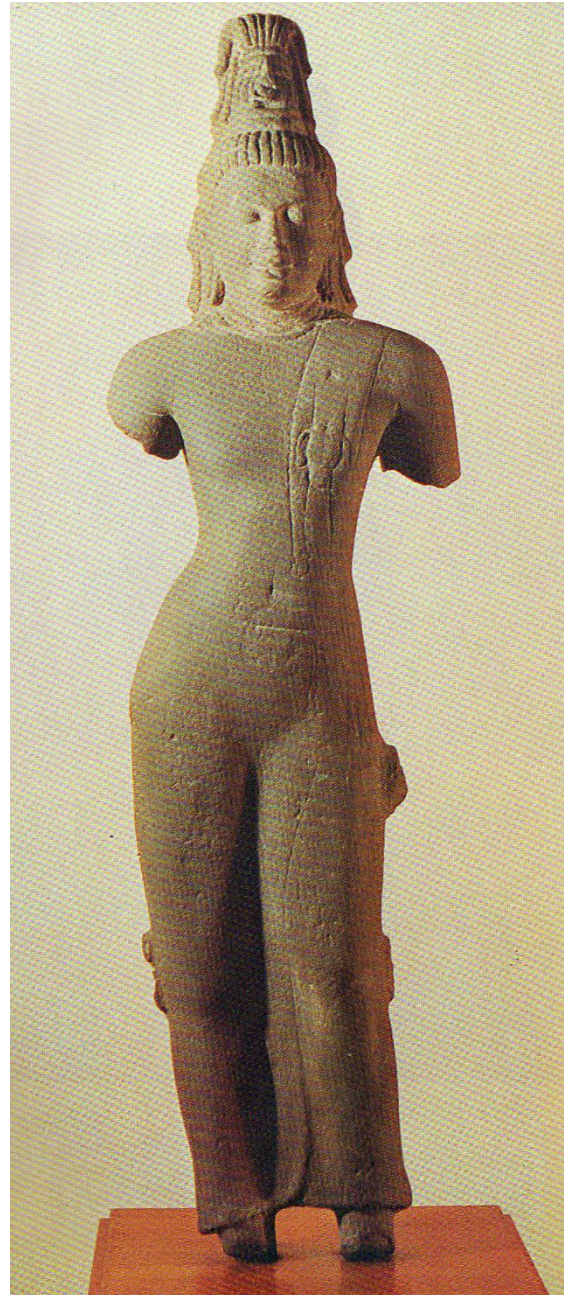

Dress: The lower garment has a dotted textile pattern and inlaid silver lines.

Belt: Floral-shaped belt clasp.

Jewellery: Necklace, bracelets, anklets, but no armbands.

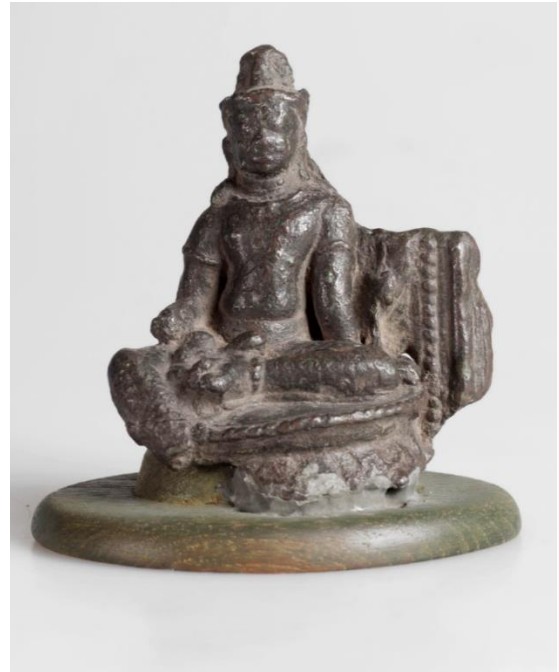

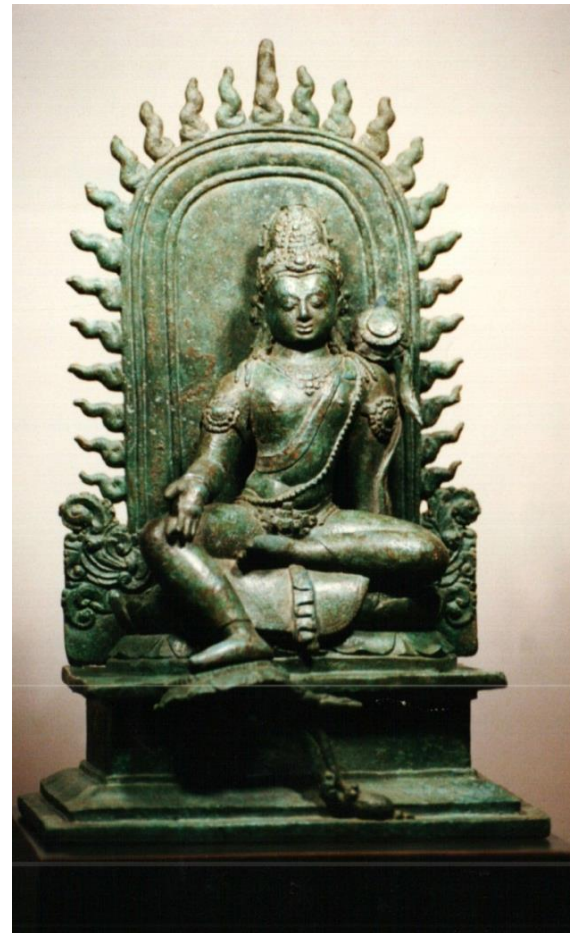

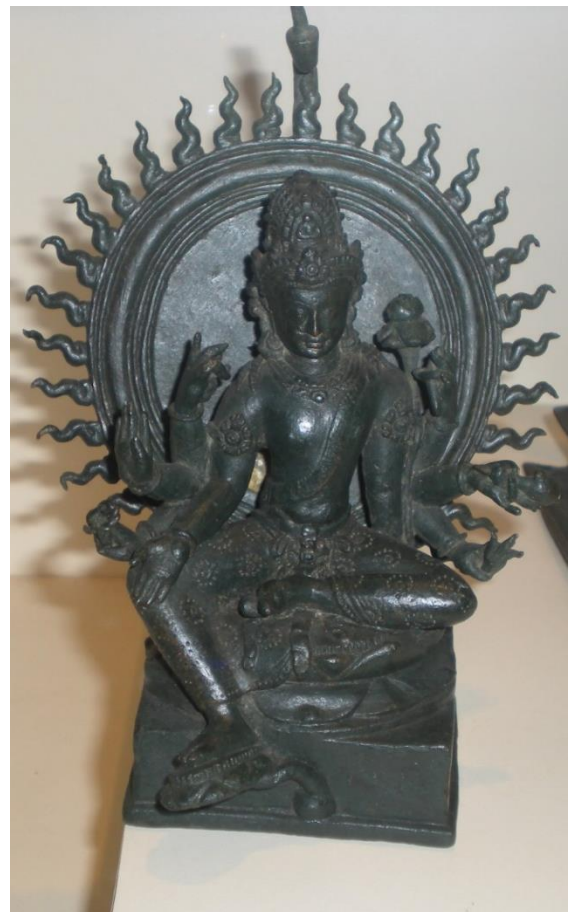

Base: The Bodhisattva sits on an oval double lotus seat and in front of the seat is a small bull. The seat rests on a larger stepped base that has a lion in front.

Other: Considering the lack of a Buddha Amitābha in the hairdo it is possible this figure to the Buddha's right is not Avalokiteśvara. However, his attributes, which are common for four-armed Javanese Avalokiteśvara statuettes, along with the figure's place within the triad indicate that the figure is indeed Avalokiteśvara.

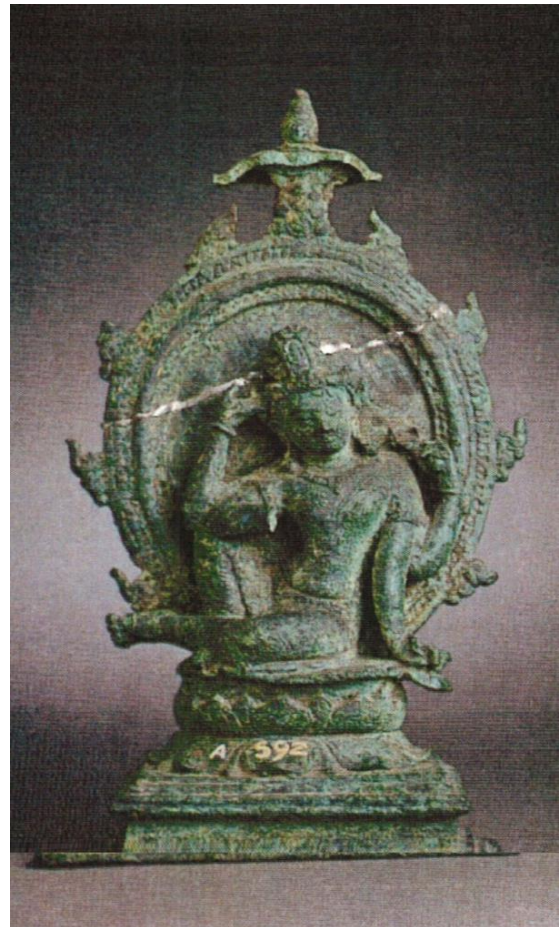

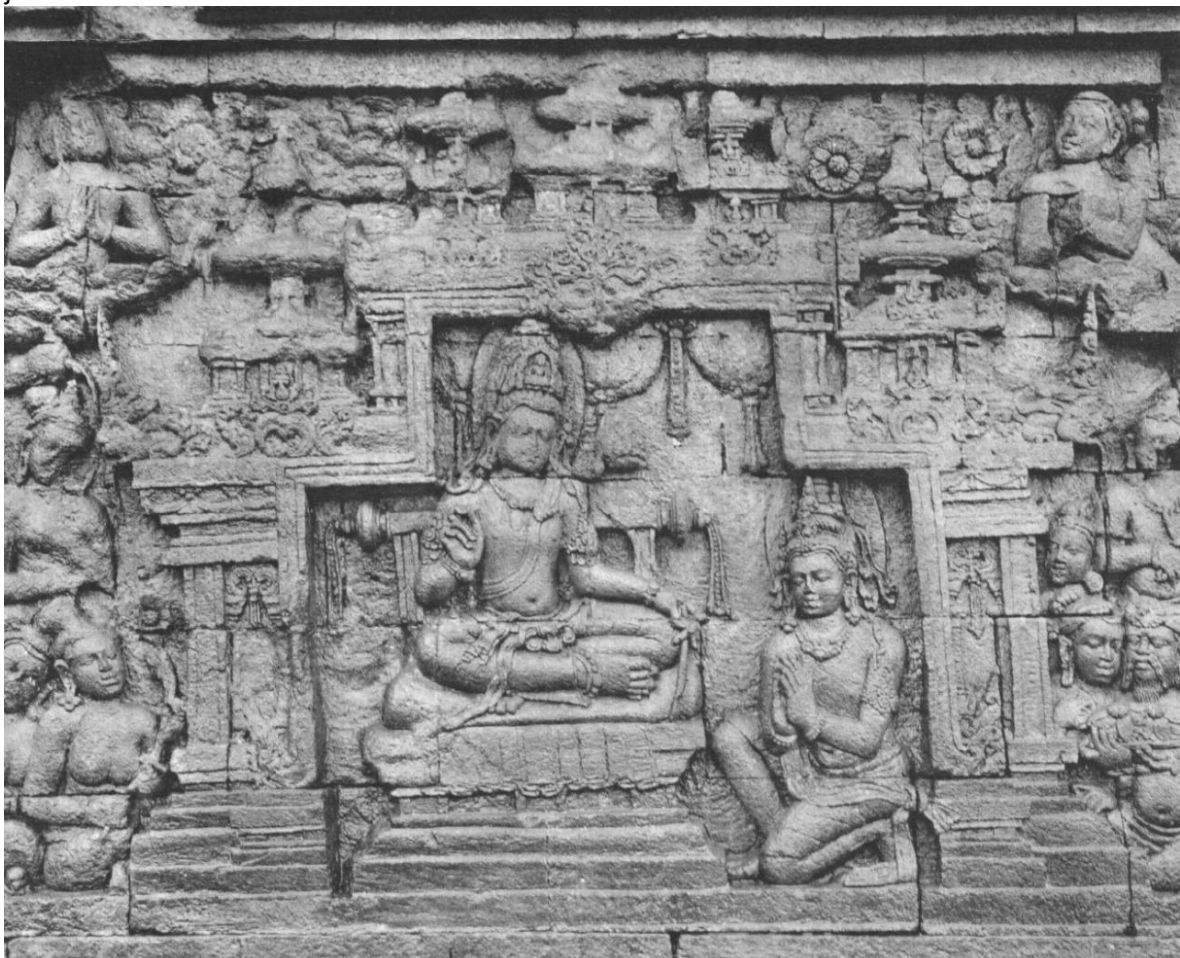

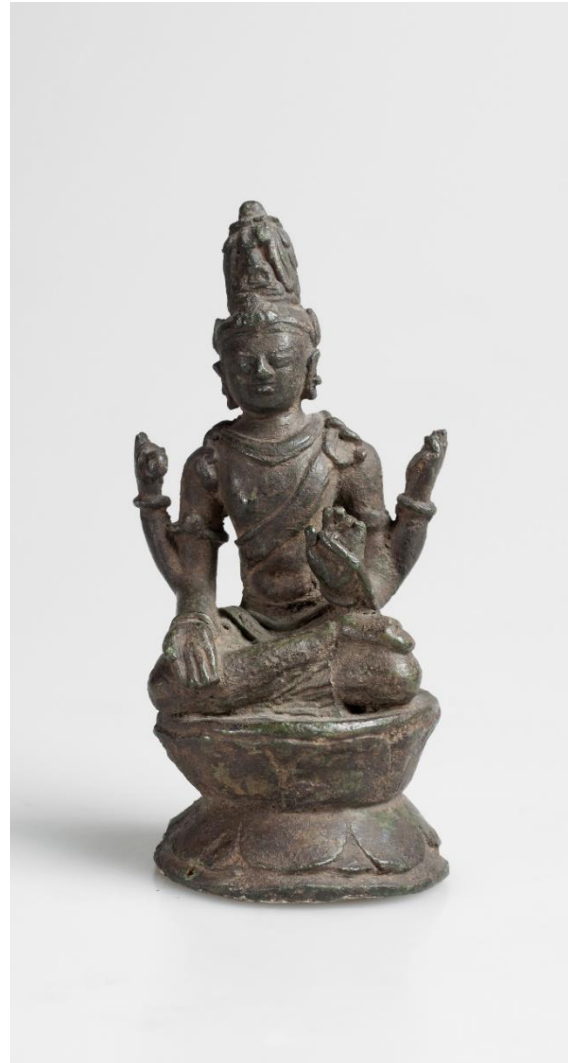

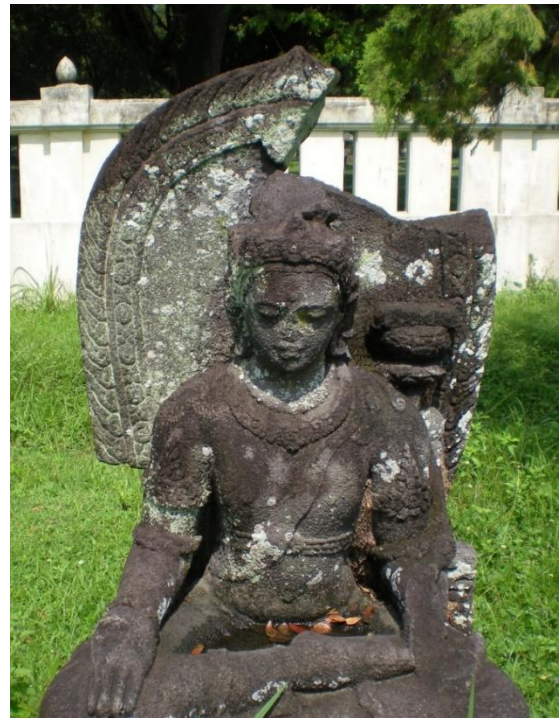

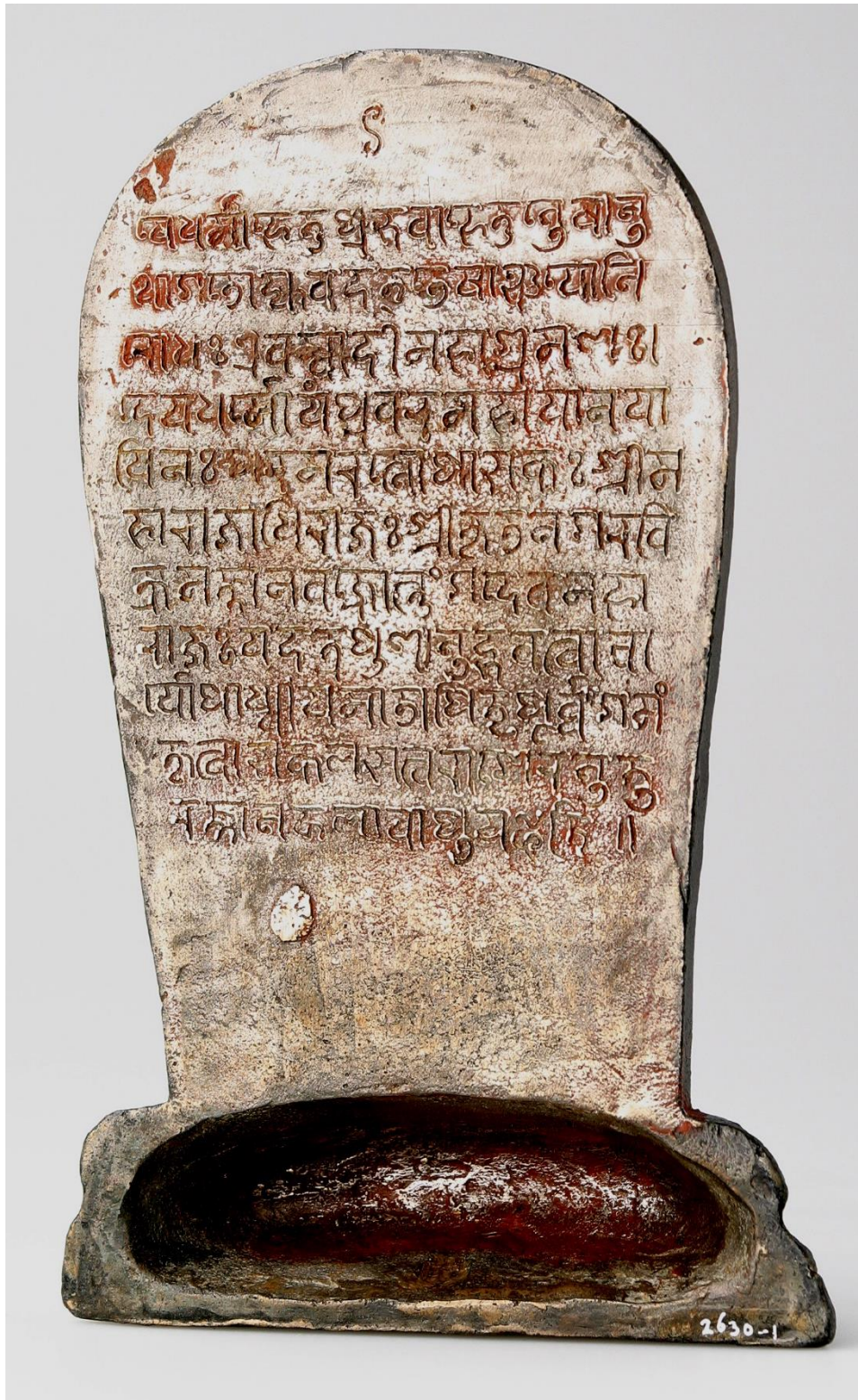

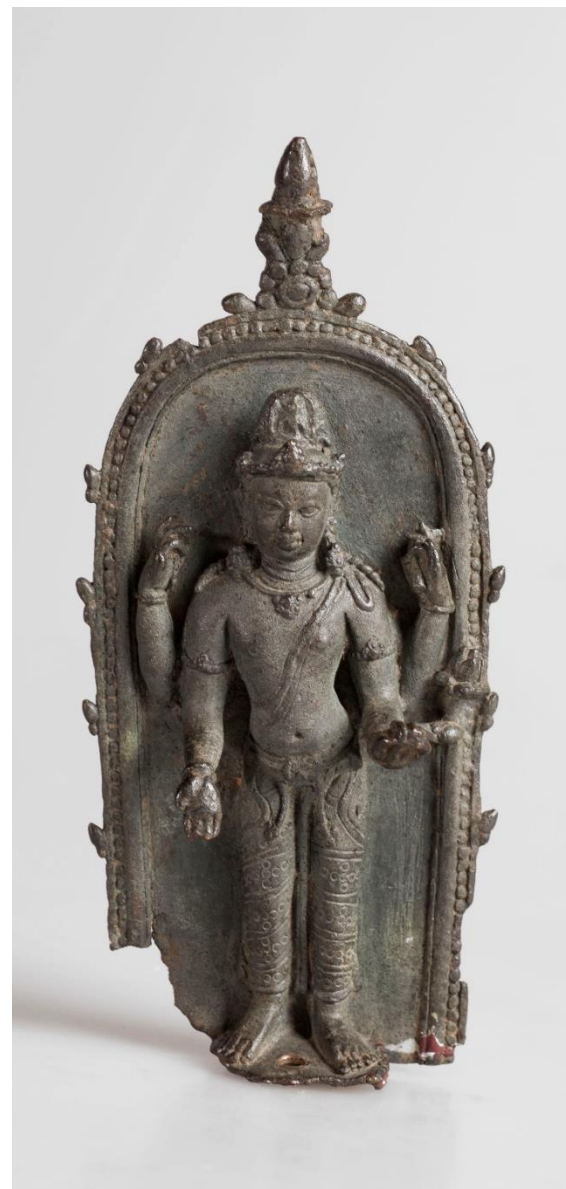

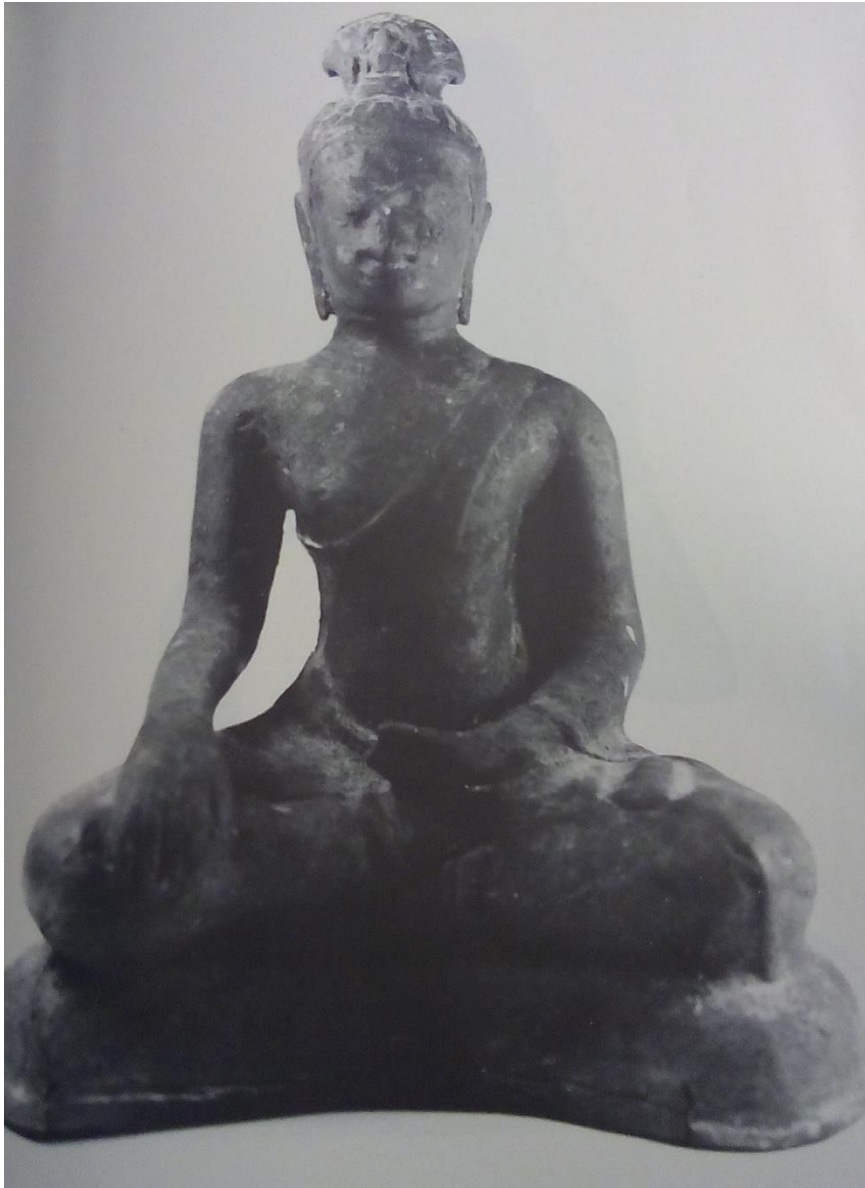

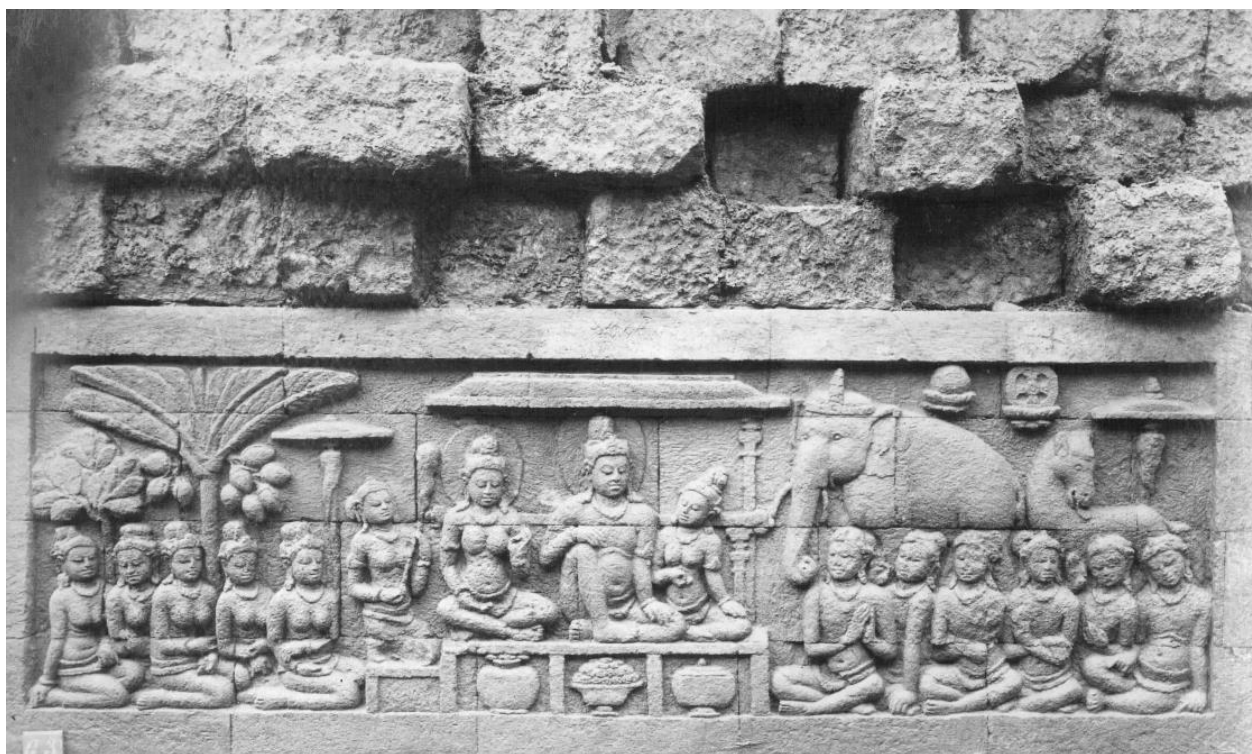
