APPENDIX 1. ROYAL INVENTORIES

DOCUMENT 1

AGS, CMC, 1st Época, Leg. 178. 1503–04.

Translation

Chamber of Queen Isabel of Castile. Accounts of Sancho de Paredes and Isabel de Cuello, his wife, and Violante de Albion, gentleman and ladies in waiting (*camareros*) of the Queen. Sections VII to CCCXXXV.

All these porcelains are in a wooden box with cotton. These porcelains were given by Violante to Juan Velazquez and Juan de Sant Roman in her name on the 18th of March in the year 505 [1505].

- One white porcelain.
- Another white porcelain with a blue spout and a blue flower in the middle of the piece.
- Another white porcelain, decorated with blue flower sprays.
- Two small white porcelains decorated with blue flower sprays.
- Another small white porcelain.

Given to Juan Velazquez on the 18th of March in the year 505 [1505]

- In the town of Medina del Campo on the 28th of April in the year 504 [1504] Violante de Albion received a large blue-and-white porcelain resembling a bowl (*bacia*) that was given by the Queen of Portugal to our Queen in a white wooden box.

Given to Juan Velazquez on the 18th of March in the year 505 [1505]

- Violante de Albion received in the town of Medina del Campo on the 30th of April in the year 504 [1504] another large white porcelain with violet flowers inside and octagonals on the outside that is as large as a medium-size washbasin that was given to her by the Ambassador of Venice on that date.

Accounts of Juan Velasquez [Royal Accountant], executor of Queen Isabella the Catholic, of the clothes, jewellery, ornaments, etc., in the Queen's chamber.

Undertaken by Violante de Aluion

Checked against the book of the chamber:

- A large white porcelain worked with blue flowers like a heart-shaped bowl (*bacia*) with points on the border [foliated edge] given to Our Majesty by the Venetian ambassador ... one porcelain.
- Jeronimo Vianelo was given the porcelain contained in the registry of our King in Valladolid, on the twenty-seventh day of the month of April of one thousand five hundred and six years. Identified by the executors ... one porcelain.

DOCUMENT 3

AGS, Section Contaduría Mayor de Cuentas (CMC), Leg. 81, Fol. 5. 1505.

Translation

Inventory of Isabel I of Castile.¹

[Isabella of Castile, the Catholic, or Isabel I de Castilla, la Católica, (1451–1504) was Queen of Castile and Leon. In 1469 she married Ferdinand II of Aragon (1452–1516) who was King of Aragon (1479–1516, as Ferdinand II), Sicily (1468–1516), Naples (1504–1516), Valencia, Sardinia, and Navarre, Count of Barcelona, King of Castile (1474–1504, as Ferdinand V) and then Regent from 1508 to his death, in the name of his mentally unstable daughter Joanna the Mad.]

- A goblet of glass known as porcelain, with black and blue leaves of the same [material], without a lid, the silver foot gilded and engraved with leaves or scales without enamel, the foot of the goblet weighing one mark and six eighths and a half; the foot of the piece is appraised at four *ducados* and the porcelain was appraised by Fernando Ballesteros at two hundred *maravedies*, including its leather box and a lion with a cloth of marine blue color. A cloth covering the lid.
- Another white porcelain goblet without a lid, the gilded silver foot with several letters and some roses in relief, with its leather box, the silver weighing one mark and two ounces, and the gold worth two *ducados* and four *maravedies*, with a lid and cover like the former.
- A small goblet of gilded silver on a porcelain bowl (*escudilla*) with a lid of the same gilded silver that together weigh one mark and three eighths and a half.
- In the town of Medina del Campo on the twenty-eighth of April of 504 [1504] Violante de Albion received a large blue-and-white porcelain resembling a bowl (*bacia*) that was given by the Queen of Portugal to our Queen in a white wooden box.

- *Una copica de plata dorada puesta en ella una escudilla porcelana con una sobrecopita de la dicha plata dorada, que peso junta un marco e tres ochavas e media.*
- *En la villa de Medina del Campo, a veinte e ocho de abril de quinientos e cuatro años, recibio la dicha Violante de Albión una porcelana grande blanca y azul tamaña como una bacia, la cual envio la señora reina de Portugal a la reina nuestra señora en servicio en una caja de madera blanca.*

DOCUMENT 4

AGS, CMC, 1st Época, Legajo 190. *Recámara* of Queen Isabella the Catholic. 1505

Translation

- Three porcelains that are ewers of the four, [that they had] each with a spout, blue and gilded, with lids, worth one thousand, six hundred and eighty-seven and a half *maravedies*.
- Another ewer with a lid, of the same shape as those above, three ducats.
- A large porcelain plate, half a ducat.
- A medium-size plate, white and blue and gilded, one ducat.
- A small porcelain, one florin.
- Six porcelain plates, of the seven that they had, for six *reales* apiece, one thousand, two hundred and twenty-four *maravedies*.
- Four porcelain plates, three for one ducat, the other one for one florin and one thousand, three hundred and ninety *maravedies*.
- Another two porcelain plates, five hundred and sixty-two *maravedies*.
- A large porcelain, like a washing-up bowl, brownish green and dark, two ducats.
- A large porcelain, white and moulded with flowers, sixteen ducats.
- Another large porcelain, round, three thousand *maravedies*.

AGS, Patronato Real, Legajo 30-6, 68. 1503-11.

Translation

- A bowl of white porcelain with an open filigree foot of twenty-two carats that together with the gold weigh one mark, three ounces and four-eighths.

- To the Count of Syruela, five small porcelains worth eight hundred and thirty-three *maravedies*.

- v To the said Doña Catalina, another one worth two ducats.
- Alvaro de Lugo, one porcelain worth one hundred and seventy-two *maravedies*.

DOCUMENT 7

AGS, CMC, 1st Época, Leg. 953. 1506-35.

Translation

Record of the distribution that was made from the chamber (*recamara*) of the Empress between Prince Philip, the Queen of Bohemia, Mary, and Princess Juana. Inventory of the goods of the Empress and the list of goods corresponding to each of her children.

[The goods in this will were bequeathed by Empress Isabel of Portugal to the following children: Philip II of Spain (1527–98), King of Spain and Portugal, Maria of Spain (1528–1603), who married her cousin, Maximilian II, Holy Roman Emperor; and to Joan of Spain (1535–73), who married her cousin Prince John of Portugal and was mother of King Sebastian of Portugal.]

- Three boxes of white wood that contain three little porcelains from the Indies, spoons, *brinquitos* and spoons with rubies mounted in silver and gold; there are three porcelains, two of chalcedony mounted in silver, another one of the same [material] without mounts, and another red one mounted in silver, and six white porcelains ... some of these small [*brincos*] were given by order of His Majesty to the princesses.
- Some objects of glass and others of earthenware (*barro*) and some porcelains that have remained aside from what was given by His Majesty to the prince and princess, and what was sold was placed in a chest ... Mençia Salcedo has them.
- A box with four porcelains, three broken, and a gilded jar ... Mençia Salcedo has them.
- Another one [box] with three porcelains.
- Another one [box] with five porcelains.
- A chest that has five large porcelains and a large porcelain jar with a lid; three are porcelains and three are jars.
- Another two large porcelain jars with their lids.
- Fourteen more porcelains of all types, and another four and three that are broken, and a red glass plate that is broken to pieces.

- *Otras catorze pieças de porcelana de todas suertes, ay quatro mas y tres quebradas e vn plato de vidrio colorado fecho pedaços.*

DOCUMENT 8

AGS, Casa y Sitios Reales, Leg. 67-3, Fols. 198v–203v. 1539.²

Translation

From the book of the chamber of Empress Isabel that was left in the possession of Mencía de Salcedo [her lady-in-waiting].

[Isabella of Portugal (1503–39) was the daughter of Manuel I of Portugal and Maria of Aragon (Mary of Aragon or Mary of Spain or even Mary of Castile, 1482–1517. She was the second wife of Portuguese King Manuel I). By her marriage to Charles V, Holy Roman Emperor, Isabella was also Holy Roman Empress and Queen Consort of Aragon and Castile.]

- A box containing a glass porcelain and a glass goblet.
- Another chest with its lock and key with five large porcelains and a porcelain jar (*tinaja*) and its lid.
- Another two porcelain jars (*tinajas*) with their lids.
- Thirty-one pieces of porcelain of all kinds, three of which are earthenware.
- A chest with its lock and key, full of jars and other pieces of pottery from Estremoz that were kept for the prince and princess.
- A box with four porcelains.
- Another box with three porcelains.
- A white wooden box, round, with five porcelains.
- Four red jars from the Indies with four boxes, one broken.
- Three white wooden boxes that contain small porcelains from the Indies, spoons and *brinquitos*, the spoons with rubies and adorned with gold and silver.

DOCUMENT 9

AGS, CMC, 1st Época, Leg. 550. 1539–41.³

Translation

Accounts of Jorje de Lima and Juan de Basurto, of the auction (*almoneda*) of the goods of the Empress [Isabella of Portugal].

[Although listed as ‘porcelain’ these were actually silver objects.] [U= 1,000]

Jorje de Lima e Juan de Basurto received different gold objects:

- A porcelain reliquary mounted in gold that has a cross and Saint and Saint Sebastian, the mount weighing one ounce and twelve grains of gold, and worth four hundred and fifty Castilian *maravedies*, was sold to Alonso de Pontamina in iiiUdcxvi *mrs* (3,616) ... A porcelain reliquary.
- A porcelain pedestal (*pie*) weighing four ounces and two eighths and a half at iiUcccc (2,400). Each mark is worth iUccxciii (1,293) *maravedies*, which was sold to Gerónimo González ... A silver base for a porcelain.
- A porcelain of gilded silver with two seraphs weighing seven ounces and seven eighths, each mark was appraised at eight ducats, that is worth iiUdccccliii (2,953) *maravedies*, that was sold to Don Alvaro de Cordoba ... A golden porcelain.

• *Mas resçebieron vna porçelana de plata dorada con dos serafines que peso siete onças y siete ochauas, tasado a ocho ducados cada marco. que monta iiUdccccliii (2.953) maravedies, en los quales se vendio Don Alvaro de Cordova. ... Una porcelana dorada.*

DOCUMENT 10

AGS, CMC, Leg. 552. 1539–48.

Translation

Accounts of Francisco Pessoa, treasurer of the Empress [Isabella of Portugal], detailing what he received from the auction (*almoneda*) of her goods. 1539–48.

- Six plates of porcelain that were sold to Lady Stephanie for four *ducados* ... iUd (1,500 *maravedies*). [U = 1,000]
- A plate of porcelain sold to the same [person] for twelve *reales* ... cccc viii ... (408 *maravedies*).
- Six small, broken porcelains that were sold to Artiaga for twelve *reales* ... cccc viii ... (408 *maravedies*).
- To the Count of Nieba three porcelains of the red type that were sold to the Count of Nieba for ... iUd (1500 *maravedies*).
- A plate of porcelain that was sold to Tello de Guzman for ten *reales* ... ccc xl (340 *maravedies*).

[An object from China appeared as]

- A coffer from China gilded with three latches and locks all in silver that was sold to the Earl of Olivares for XV *ducados* ... v U dcxxv (5,625 *maravedies*).

DOCUMENT 11

AGS, Patronato Real, Leg. 30-19. 1551.

Translation

Account of the gold and silver objects that were in the possession of Mencía de Salcedo [lady in waiting to Queen Isabella of Portugal] that will be divided between Queen Mary of Bohemia and Infanta Doña Juana, and the amounts at which they were appraised.

[Maria of Spain (Madrid, 1528–1603) and Joan of Spain (in Castilian, Juana de Austria, (1535–73) were the daughters of Charles V and Isabella of Portugal.]

- [Fol. 64v] A white silver mirror with a small eagle on top made of the same silver, the glass of margarita stone from the Indies, weighing as it is four marks and seven eighths and stored in a small white and coloured basket that was appraised at three thousand *maravedies*.
- A mother-of-pearl jar (*barril*) mounted with silver and decorated with emeralds and fake rubies, the foot and mouth are of silver, appraised at ten *ducados*.
- [Fol. 65] Another spoon made of carnelian, agate and chalcedony mounted with gilded silver, appraised at four *ducados*.
- [Fol. 66] A jasper mortar without a pestle, appraised at one *ducado*.
- [Fol. 67] A fan (*moscador*) from the Indies, made of coloured shells and silver handles, appraised at one *ducado*.
- A small box with three porcelains, two of chacedony mounted with silver, another one of the same [material] without mounts, and another coloured one with silver mounts, the four porcelains appraised at one *ducado* each.
- Some *bucaro* and jars from Extremo [Estremoz, Portugal], many of which are broken.
- Other porcelains and *brinquinos* of porcelain clay.
- [Fol. 67v] A fan (*moscador*) from the Indies, made of painted paper.
- Three large flat porcelains and three porcelain pots.
- Four complete pieces of porcelain and three broken.
- [Fol. 85] A porcelain gilded inside and outside, carved with beasts, weighing one mark, five ounces and four eighths.
- A small box with three porcelains, two of chalcedony with silver mounts, another one of the same [material] with mounts, and another red one mounted in silver.

- Sixty porcelains of different shapes and sizes, some of them very large, one with a gold-rim around the foot weighing eight-and-a-half *castellanos*, one is broken, and three are chipped. The valuation of these is in another document.

- [Fol. 832] Twelve jugs (*cantaros*) of glazed clay, eight white and four blue-and-white made in the shape of a jar (*tinaja*) with narrow necks, handles and the Royal coat of arms, appraised at twelve *reales*.
- [Fol. 832v] Two very large blue-and-white porcelain pots (*ollas*) with lids and finials, decorated with ropes with two handles of the same rope, appraised at two hundred *reales* each.
- Two large porcelain vase (*duernos*), shaped as a half-jar (*tinaja*), blue-and-white on the outside and white inside, without lids, appraised at four hundred *reales*.
- Seventeen round porcelain jars (*ollas*) all with lids, some larger than others, blue-and-white on the outside and white inside, with knobs on the lids appraised at one hundred *reales* each.

Translation

Inventory of the treasury that contains the accounts and data of Hernando de Espejo, treasurer of the objects of King Philip III of the objects for his service as a result of the auction of King Philip II and Queen Anne of Austria.

Infanta Doña 'Ysavel', or Infanta Isabella Clara Eugenia of Spain (1566–1633), the daughter of Philip II of Spain and his third wife Elizabeth of Valois, inherited most of the porcelain in this inventory. On 18 April 1599, Isabella married her cousin, Archduke Albert of Austria, the younger brother of her former fiancé Rudolf II. They ruled the Spanish Netherlands together from 1601, and after Albert's death Isabella became the Governor of the Netherlands on behalf of the King of Spain. The reign of Albert and Isabella is considered part of the Golden Age of the Netherlands.

As we can see from the inventory, a good number of the objects were inherited by Isabella, and possibly taken to the Netherlands. King Philip III and Queen Margaret of Austria inherited some of the pieces in 1617 (Document 25); others were later sold to third parties in an auction that took place

after this document was compiled, between 1608 and 1609.

They are comparing three documents: the list of the goods of King Philip II, details of his estate sale, and what was left for Philip III. Of the 27 ewers in Philip II's possession and which are listed in the inventory drawn up after his death, Hernando de Espejo only took possession of 22 when he became royal treasurer on the death of Antonio Voto (Philip II's treasurer), which were intended to be sold in the auction (1608–9). The five missing ewers were sent to Isabel Clara Eugenia in Flanders by her brother Philip III as part of a group of 300 porcelain pieces that were either willed to her by Philip II or gifts from her brother who was aware of her interest in the exotic. Philip III issued a royal decree in Valladolid on 29 March 1603 to make Voto relinquish these five ewers. This was to serve as a receipt for the Voto family. Voto's heirs had to show the warrant (similar to a receipt) to those drawing up this inventory to prove that they did not have to surrender these ewers.]

Porcelain goods

There is an entry on page 833 of the said or mentioned inventory [the post-mortem inventory of Philip II] for 27 porcelain ewers with handles, spouts and lids of various kinds, appraised at (or listed at) 9 reales each. Only 22 of these came into the possession of Hernando Despexo. There is an entry for 8262 *maravedies* in section 346 of the State sale document. It seems that the five remaining wash-basins were sent to Infanta Isabella as part of a group of 300 porcelain objects that were included in the the Royal decree issued in Valladolid on 19 March 1603. Despite this, the verdict here goes against the aforementioned claimants until such a time as they can prove their claims.

- [Fol. 169] Another carpet from India, old and worn, [measuring] five and a half *varas* long and three wide, at thirty *reales*.

Gold jewellery with or without stones:

- [Fol. 175] Twelve bezar stones of different sizes appraised at four hundred *reales* an ounce that weigh nine ounces and are worth one hundred twenty-two thousand and four hundred.
- Five Oriental bezar stones were given to the countess of Lemos, lady-in-waiting, in a coffer or ivory case and were appraised at the mentioned four *reales* and three eighths an ounce, adding up to fifty-nine thousand and five hundred *msr.* [*maravedies*].

Cabinets mounted in silver, copper and other objects:

- [Fol. 182] A cabinet (*escritorio*) from India with eight copper-plated corners and all its drawers and keys with silver nails, appraised at five hundred *reales*.
- Another writing desk from India with eight copper sides, two locks (*aldabas cerradura*) and two braces, that is the same size and shape as the previous one, appraised at five hundred *reales*.
- A [type of] cabinet (*escritorio*) for accounts (*contador*) made of ebony, ivory and wood from the Indies with silver corners and has twenty-one drawers, appraised at one thousand *reales*.

Jewellery section and other objects:

- [Fol. 197] First of all, a long bezoar stone inside a gold filigree box; the stone alone weighed one ounce and the box four eighths and a half, appraised at forty *ducados*, of no. 42 in the inventory.
- A long bezoar stone inside another filigree box like that above, weighing four eighths and two eighths and a half. The box is appraised at twenty *ducados*.
- Another round bezoar stone inside a gold filigree box. The stone alone weighed seven eighths and the box less than four; appraised at forty *ducados*.
- A piece of Oriental bezoar stone larger than the previous one, weighing five eighths and a

half without a box, at two hundred and fifty-five *reales*.

- Another round bezar stone larger than the previous one, weighing one ounce and two eighths, appraised at five hundred *reales*.
- Another two long bezoar stones, one has a missing end, and a third has apparently been sawn in half; the three [stones] weigh two ounces, are Oriental and are inside a triangular cardboard box covered with coloured leather, appraised at seven hundred *reales*.
- Twenty-nine small bezoar stones of different shapes and sizes, all weighing one ounce and two eighths, appraised at four hundred *reales*.
- Another large stone from the Indies [*tilla*, possibly from the Antilles] weighing ten ounces, appraised at forty ducados.
- Another large stone like the one above, in pieces, weighing six ounces, appraised at twenty-four *ducados*.

[Another page in the inventory records a 'unicorn horn' that was given by Don Jeronimo de Villafuerte.]

In the care of the mentioned Hernando de Rojas, the gilded silver that was given to Doña Beatriz Guerra and also the silver in inventory no. 94.

- [Fol. 43] A porcelain with two handles and a foot of gilded silver inside a box, appraised at twelve *ducados*, the porcelain was broken and the mounts weighed thirty-five *reales* in the final valuation.
- Another two smaller porcelains with handles and a foot of gilded silver, appraised at twelve *ducados*.
- Another porcelain with handles and a foot of gilded silver, and the mounts of another one that broke, inside a small chest, appraised at forty *reales*. Was re-appraised at thirty-two *reales*.

In the care of the mentioned Hernando de Rojas, the cabinets given by Doña Beatriz Guerra.

- [Fol. 99v] Another cabinet from India with eight copper-plated sides, all the drawers and keys with silver nails, appraised at two hundred *reales*. Furniture specialist (*samblador*) Gregorio Navarro appraised it at five hundred *reales* in Madrid on the twenty-ninth of May [in the year] one thousand six hundred and twelve.
- [Fol. 100] Another cabinet from India with eight copper sides, two locks and two braces, with a green velvet cover on a gold ground with *alamanes* [?] and *franxas* [?] covered with red velvet and appraised with such a cover at two hundred *reales*. Fans, Portuguese linen, different coloured silks and three linen ribbons were found in the drawers of the writing desk. It was appraised, with the cover, at five hundred *reales* on the said day.

In the care of Hernando de Rojas, the porcelains, crystals and aquamarines. [The entire section is included although only a few ceramic and porcelain objects are described.]

- [Fol. 106] First of all, in the care of Hernando de Rojas, five small porcelains that are inside a box (*pinto?*), which is of no value [the box], and [the porcelains] were appraised at ten *reales*.
- Different crystal objects related to aquamarines inside a box, appraised at twelve *reales*.
- Some broken aquamarine crystals inside a round wooden beech box that have no value.
- A jar of *terra sigilata* clay that has a broken handle that is inside a wooden white box, and is appraised at eight *reales*.
- A wooden box with aquamarine points on the inside, appraised at twenty-four *reales*.
- One hundred and twenty small containers [*bucaros*] of different shapes that were found in

a chest from Portugal studded with black leather and lined with taffeta (*paxico?*), with gilded lock, key and *clavazón* [clouage, possibly the metal fittings of a chest], appraised at three *ducados*, and which is included in the cabinets section. The *bucaros* were appraised at eight *maravedies*, adding up to a total amount of nine hundred and sixty *maravedies*.

- A chain of black crystal that was found in the drawer of an ebony cabinet with eight corners, appraised at four *reales*.
- Some tips [*puntas?*], a chain and buttons of jet that were found in a writing desk, appraised at six *reales*.
- Three chains that are called *argenteria*, two of them consisting of two strands each, the other one appraised at twenty-one *reales*.
- A paper with tips of jet and other things, appraised at four *reales*.
- A green agate bowl (*escudilla*), appraised at ten *ducados*. Reappraised at fifty *reales*.
- An octagonal mortar in white alabaster, appraised at twelve *reales*.
- A jar of gilded cork, appraised at twelve *reales*.
- Two blue aquamarine chains, appraised at twelve *reales*.
- A jar from India with a gold and black laquered spout and a bronze mount that connects the body and spout. Appraised at ten *ducados*. Reappraised at eight *ducados*.
- Another aquamarine jar, broken, with a gilded bronze handle and mounts with six silver *encontados* [a Brazilian word meaning mythical figures] in the handles, inside a box, appraised at eighty-eight *reales*.
- An aquamarine fish shaped as a serpent mounted with gilded bronze with two claws as feet, inside a box, appraised at three hundred and thirty *reales*.
- [Fol. 107] A container with two copper jars inside, appraised at six *ducados*.
- An iron-gilded ship as a small toy (*brinco*), with a small trophy inside, appraised at eight *reales*.
- A steel toy (*brinco*) scimitar of no value.
- A paper with flaws that was found inside an ivory chest and is of no value.
- [Fol. 107v] Two green jasper balls slightly larger than a first with gilded bronze feet, appraised at ten *ducados*.
- Some aquamarine buttons (*botones*), some blue, some green that were given by Doña Maria, 25 being appraised at twelve *reales*.
- Two aquamarine chains, appraised at twelve *reales*.
- More aquamarine and green-paste chains (*cadena*s) that are in the care of Hernando de Rojas, appraised at twenty-four *reales*.
- Nineteen green-paste busts of emperors mounted with gilded bronze, one broken and another damaged, and seven gilded bronze crowns inside a box that were given by the Marquis de la Laguna on the twelfth of November 1611. Appraised at three hundred and thirty *reales* each.
- Another aquamarine fish shaped as a serpent mounted with gilded bronze with two claws as feet, inside a box, appraised at three hundred and thirty *reales*, which is the same as the one given by Doña Beatriz Guerra that has been inventoried and placed in the care of Hernando de Espejo.

- Four aquamarine pyramids mounted in gilded bronze with a square foot the size of two thirds [of a *vara*], appraised at twelve *ducados*.
- Twenty-four pyramids mounted with gilded bronze, slightly smaller than the previous one but with the same feet as mentioned by Francisco Beltran de Echevarri, treasurer (*guardajoyas*) of His Highness, and which were received by Hernando de Espejo, appraised at twelve *ducados* each.
- A blue crystal chain with silver sheets that was found in a drawer of an open cabinet lined with red velvet that was given by Beatriz Guerra and is [recorded] in the Silver section on page 11 and appraised at six *reales*.
- Two small boxes for jars covered with black velvet and red cloth, one of them contains two crystal jars with tin rim and screw thread [for the lid] and straps, appraised at twenty-four *reales*.
- Nine jasper tiles of different colours, appraised at two *reales* each = it seems they are made of plaster and are appraised at one *real* each.
- A jasper stone for *ara* [?] of different colours, a third [of a *vara*] in length, appraised at sixty-six *reales* – it appears to be made of plaster and was instead appraised at twelve *reales*.
- An ivory bowl (*bernegal*), appraised at two *ducados*.
- Twenty-four buffalo bone (*bufano*) and mother-of-pearl points; each pair appraised at two *reales*; reappraised at one *real* per pair.
- Another ten pairs of points of the same [material], of various shapes, each pair appraised at the stated amount.
- Twenty buffalo bone and mother-of-pearl roses with the mentioned points, appraised at twelve *reales*.
- A black leather spoon, appraised at two *reales*
- Two natural rocky amethyst pebbles, appraised at thirty *reales*.
- An wooden oratory of the Nativity gilded and decorated with many figures and angels with false stones and other crystal objects that is one *vara* in height and six thumbs (*dedos*) wide, appraised at four hundred and forty *reales*.

[What follows is transcribed from a completely different page of the bundle (the bundle had around 600 pages), which was dated 1596 and related to goods belonging to Isabella Clara Eugenia. Not numbered]

Account of the expenses of Hernando de Rojas, keeper of the Princess' wardrobe and jewellery, in 1596. The account amounts to one thousand, nine hundred and thirty-six reales and fifteen *maravedies* of a total amount of sixty-five thousand and three *maravedies*.

- Bought one white wicker basket to carry some porcelains, appraised at one and a half *reales*.
- Bought six porcelain bowls (*escudillas*) and six small plates of the same material for His Highness that cost fifty-five *reales*.
- Two *reales* [to pay] the King's muleteer for one day to transport these porcelains.
- One pound of fibre to wrap these porcelains, two *reales*.

[On another page of the same bundle, not numbered]

Treasury 1580 to 1589' in accounts of Xpobal [Cristóbal] de Oviedo, treasurer and keeper of the Princess' wardrobe. Expenses incurred in my trade.

- Paid on the twentieth of May nine *reales* for two porcelains for bloodletting.

[On another page of the same bundle, not numbered]

Juan Cornelio, of the King's Royal Chamberlain, was in charge of:

- Hernando de Espejo
 - Two porcelain bowls (*escudillas*) from the Indies for the service of His Majesty, inside a wooden box covered in black leather. In Madrid on the 17th of January 1612. Signed Juan Cornelio.

[On another page, not numbered]

In the care of Francisco de Colmenares, His Majesty's head of sauces (*salsier*), the silver and other things for the service of His Majesty.

[Everything is silver except]

- Two porcelains with feet and silver mounts to serve His Majesty's *consommé*.
- Three porcelains with feet and silver mounts to serve *consommé* at His Majesty's table.
- Another two porcelains with feet and silver mounts to serve His Majesty's *consommé*, in a box covered in black leather and lined in red *frisa* [a type of cloth] with a strap and a button to secure it.
- Two large porcelains to serve His Majesty's soup on the fish days. One larger than the other one, with a border around the spout.

[The same page of the previous entry also includes the following]

- [Fol. 2v] Hernando de Espejo, His Majesty's treasurer:
 - Eight bags, five medium-sized ones for plates, two smaller ones for small plates and a larger bag for large plates, all of them in tanned skin (*baqueta*) lined with scarlet woollen cloth (*frisa*) with straps and buckles to wrap secure them, which were made by Pedro Diez de Cabrera.
- Hernando de Espejo:
 - Six wooden boxes, the interiors and exteriors lined with a scarlet woollen cloth [*frisa*, a type of cloth], with black leather straps to secure them
 - Four of them [the boxes] contain the bowls in which His Majesty's *consommé* is served, and two jugs of the same size with undulating borders in which His Majesty's vinegar is served.
- [Fol. 3] Francisco de Colmenares, the King's head of sauces (*salsier*), received from Hernando de Espejo, his treasurer, two porcelains from India shaped as two bowls (*caçuelas*), one fourth of [a *vara* in] diameter that are used to serve His Majesty's soup on the fish days. They were given to me as replacements for other broken ones that were in the service of His Majesty, and was signed in Madrid on the sixth of December 1610.
- On the 5th of March of the year 1612, Hernando de Espejo:
 - Three porcelains from India shaped as the usual bowls (*escudilla*) that were given to me to serve His Majesty's *consommé*; it is signed by = Francisco de Colmenares.
- On the 20th of November in Madrid, Hernando de Espejo received a large porcelain bowl (*albornia*) from India to serve His Majesty a Flemish soup.
 - Hernando de Espejo two porcelain bowls (*escudillas*) from India.

- Hernando de Espejo six porcelain bowls (*escudillas*) from India; four are small and two large, to serve. 18 July 1618.
- Hernando de Espejo eight porcelains six small bowls (*escudillas*) and two larger ones, signed on 15 April 1619.

[The following pieces are those left for the use of Philip III and Margaret of Austria after the auction of his father Philip II. Hernando de Espejo was the treasurer of Queen Margaret of Austria and later also of King Philip III. This document must be related to two other documents, the first being the inventory of the will of Philip II (Document 20),¹¹ and Document 21 which specifies the pieces inherited by Isabella Clara Eugenia and the ones included in the auction that took place between 1608 and 1609. The 'idem' numbers refer to the folio numbers of the manuscript.]

Hernando de Espejo is in charge of the porcelains, crystal containers [*bucaros*, see Glossary] and pottery that was left for the use of His Majesty, p. 346.

- (Checked against the royal inventory no. 832). Firstly, two porcelain jugs (*cantaros*), each with two handles, two spouts and lids with four figures of angels playing the flute with flowers in relief on the lid; on the handles and spouts four figures *al brutesco* [in rural style, see Glossary] that are five sesmas tall, appraised at six hundred *reales*. ... The following were received from Hernando de Espejo=D. Pacheco on 16 June 1621 (check):

- Two alabaster head of emperors of one third in height.
- One alabaster fountain with a gilded moulding.

- One coloured bowl (*escudilla*) with a gilded decoration and green lines, of one *sesma* in diameter and a *sesma* in height.

D. Francisco Tamayo de Villalta, His Majesty's treasurer, in charge of the different types of porcelains from India of Portugal that were received from Jeronimo de Villafuerte's heirs.

- [Fol. 1] First of all he is in charge of two large porcelain (*borzelana*) vases of three quarters in

height with two handles and with two snakes [decoration?] and a lid, and another with two snakes and a lid with four children playing the trumpet; the knob and one of the children's heads are missing from the lid.

[This was the VII Duke of Medinaceli, Antonio Juan de la Cerda y Toledo (1607–71), Grandee of Spain, Captain General of Valencia until 1641, married at the age of 17, on 28 November 1625, in Dos Hermanas, province of Seville, to a 13-year-old girl known as Ana Francisca Luisa Enriquez de Ribera y Portocarrero, later V Duchess of Alcalá de los Gazules.]

[In the margin] This porcelain cargo was sent to our Lady the Queen's treasurer.

The said Francisco Tamayo, treasurer of His Majesty, is in the care of the porcelain from China that was sent by the Duke of Medinaceli, of the Council of State and War, General Captain of the Ocean and Coast of Andalucía, which was given by Pedro de la Cruz y Çuñiga in San Lucar – and was taken from the smuggled goods of Juan Vangel and arrived at court complete but with some breakage. Captain Don Manuel Ladron de Guevara was charged with putting it in nine square boxes in the Royal Palace of this court in the lower room of our Lord the Prince who is in heaven

The mentioned boxes were opened by the Count of Montasis, the oldest Major-domo, who His Majesty ordered to remove the porcelain and place it on sea straw in the boxes and that Francisco Tamayo was in charge of them as follows:

- First of all he is in charge of one thousand, six hundred and seventy small, medium and large bowls (*escudillas*) of blue cold and some scarlet porcelain from China, all complete, the broken ones having been sent separately ... *escudillas* ... 1670.
- In charge of twenty-one large dishes of one-third of the diameter of the same blue porcelain, less fine, complete ... large plates ... 21.
- In charge of three hundred and eighteen ordinary plates and deep porcelains from China with blue work, the broken ones have been selected and separated ... ordinary plates and small porcelains ... 318.
- In charge of three hundred and fifty small plates of one *sesma* in diameter of the same kind of Chinese porcelain, some smaller, some finer than others; the complete ones have been separated from the broken ones...small plates ... 350.
- In charge of one hundred and sixty-six cups and small pieces of porcelain of the same type, complete ... cups and small porcelains ... 166.
- In charge of thirty-eight small preserving pots of the mentioned porcelain complete ... small

preserving pots ... 38.

Account of the porcelain from China sent by the Duke of Medinaceli in 1656.

Account of the porcelain from China delivered to Pedro de la Cruz y Zuñiga in the city of San Lucar [Cádiz] [that was] taken from Juan Vangel, resident of the said city, by order of the Duke of Medinaceli, Major of the Council of State and War, General Captain of the Ocean Coasts and Army of Andalucía. All the pieces, including the damaged ones, were given to Pedro de la Cruz, and then to Captain Don Manuel Ladron de Guevara to take His Majesty's court.

In San Lucar six hundred and seventy-two plates were delivered as follows:

- Two hundred and sixty-four plates.
- Ninety medium-size plates.
- Three hundred and six smaller plates.
- Two larger plates.
- Also two thousand one hundred and twelve bowls (*escudillas*).
- One thousand four hundred and sixteen large and small bowls (*escudillas*).
- One hundred and forty-four bowls (*escudillas*) of the ordinary type.
- One hundred and twenty large bowls (*escudillas*).
- Four hundred and thirty-two small bowls (*escudillas*).
- And all the other plates and bowls (*escudillas*) make a total of two thousand seven hundred and four pieces.

Delivered to the said Pedro de la Cruz and Captain Don Manuel Ladron de Guevara the pieces of said porcelain from China with the given names, in nine crates numbered from no. 1 to no. 9 as follows:

- No. 1: Seventy-two small plates, eighty-three plates and one hundred and five bowls (*escudillas*).
- No. 2: Eighty-one plates, thirty-six bowls (*escudillas*), thirty-three small porcelains and eight large cups.
- No. 3: Two hundred and forty-one large cups (*taças*), seventeen small plates, five plates and two porcelains.
- No. 4: Forty-nine medium-size cups (*taças*) and four hundred and thirty-four bowls (*escudillas*).
- No. 5: One hundred and one small plates, one hundred and seventy-nine bowls (*escudillas*) and twenty-one porcelains.
- No. 6: With the coarser pottery, including seventy-one cups (*taças*), one hundred and forty-eight small plates and forty-five plates.
- No. 7: Four hundred ninety-nine bowls (*escudillas*) and seventy-one small plates.
- No. 8: Another chest with a coarser [porcelain] that includes twenty-three large plates and forty-eight small plates and two hundred and eighty-four bowls (*escudillas*).
- No. 9: Another chest with twelve plates and ninety-four cups (*taças*) of the said coarse pottery and the rest of the crate consists of forty-two broken plates and bowls (*escudillas*).

All the porcelain items from China were given by Pedro de la Cruz to Capitan Don Manuel Ladron de Guevara in nine chests, making a total of two thousand seven hundred and seventy-four pieces.

Translation

General Account of the jewellery and furniture that is in the treasury, according to the

inventory made after the death of the King Philip V, 1774.

[These documents list the jewellery and possessions of Philip V (1683–1746), King of Spain from 1700 to 1746 and the first monarch from the Bourbon dynasty in Spain. The only extant Chinese porcelain service in this country corresponds to his reign and most of it is kept in the Royal Palace (see p. 128) in Madrid. This is the complete inventory of the pieces which has never been published before. It is also interesting to note that, as is stated in the inventory, the service was taken from the estate of the ‘Queen Mother’, Isabella de Farnesio, who was the mother of Charles III of Spain (1716–88), who reigned in 1774 although Isabella de Farnesio (1692–1766) had died in 1766.]
