1. Definitions:

- "**Affiliate**" means any entity which directly or indirectly controls, is controlled by or is under common control of a Party to this agreement; the term 'control' as used herein shall mean the possession of the power to direct or cause the direction of the management and the policies of an entity, whether through the ownership of a majority of the outstanding voting rights or by contract or otherwise.
- "**Confidential Information**" means all information of whatever nature including, but not limited to, plans, reports, analyses, studies, drawings, designs, models, specifications, video material, demonstrations and presentations, communicated by the Disclosing Party to the Receiving Party under whatever form, or obtained during a visit at the other Party's

premises, or otherwise obtained from the other Party, before or after execution of the present agreement, which is information the nature of which is such that it would normally be considered confidential or proprietary except for the information which the Receiving Party can prove (a) is, at the time of disclosure, in the public domain, or (b) after disclosure, becomes part of the public domain by publication or otherwise, except by breach of this agreement by the Receiving Party, or (c) is obtained by the Receiving Party from a third party not in breach of any obligation of confidentiality, or (d) was known or used by the Receiving Party prior to the date of the disclosure by the Disclosing Party, except by breach of this agreement, or which, based on written evidence, has been independently developed by the Receiving Party prior to the disclosure, except by breach of this agreement, or (e) is required to be disclosed by the Receiving Party pursuant to any applicable law or judicial or governmental order, provided that the Receiving Party shall give immediate written notice of such requirement to the other Party with the view to agreeing the timing and the content of such disclosure. 7. Return of Confidential Information
