#### 9.1 Curriculum Vitae

Huayu Zhang was born in Qiqihar, Heilongjiang Province, China in 1989. In 2007, he started his undergraduate study in Peking University Health Science Center majoring in basic medicine. From 2010, he joined the research group led by Prof. Liu Guoqing and Dr. Qi Rong investigating the anti-inflammatory effect of dendrimers. He obtained Bachelor of Science degree in 2012 and was awarded the Leiden University Excellent Scholarship for his master of science study in Leiden University Medical Center majoring biomedical sciences. He did a 6-month internship in Endocrinology department, Leiden University Medical Center, on the subject of effect of exendin-4 in atherosclerosis and liver inflammation, supervised by Prof. Patrick Rensen, Prof. Yanan Wang and Dr. Edwin Parlevliet. With a sponsorship from Eurolife foundation, he did a 9-month exchange studentship in Roslin insitute, University of Edinburgh, on the subject of influence of CpG dinucleotide frequencies on flu infectivity, supervised by Prof. Peter Simmonds and Dr. Nicky Atkinson.

After obtaining his Master of Science degree in 2014, he joined the group led by Prof. Anton Jan van Zonneveld and Dr. Janine van Gils for his PhD training. His research focused on the function of neuronal guidance cues in endothelial cell and monocyte biology and the implication of monocytic expression of neuronal guidance cues in coronary heart disease patients.
