Perioperative opioid analgesia in different patient populations

1. In cardiac surgery patients, perioperative remifentanil does not lead to chronic postoperative pain one year after surgery. *This thesis.*
2. The clinical impact of increased acute postoperative pain upon the perioperative use of remifentanil is low. *This thesis.*
3. In children undergoing cardiac surgery, an increase in dosage of morphine does not result in less postoperative pain. *This thesis.*
4. Morphine does not need weight-based dose adjustments in morbidly obese patients. *This thesis.*
5. Too often, pain is treated as a purely biomedical problem while it is a biopsychosocial condition. *Adapted from Darnal, 2018, Nature 557, 7*
6. In children, model-based dosing of opioids for optimal pain treatment should be implemented.
