## **Curriculum Vitae**

Aditi Mukherjee is a PhD Candidate at the Leiden University. Her PhD dissertation is titled *In the shadow of Displaceability: Experience of Refugees and Migrants in suburban Calcutta*, funded by the Erasmus Mundus IBIES PhD fellowship. Her PhD dissertation draws on ethnographic research with two migrant groups in Calcutta and North 24 Parganas in West Bengal, India and address questions of displacement and citizenship within third world contexts. She is associated with the 1947 Partition Archive based at Berkeley, California as a Citizen Historian. Her broad research interests include processes of third world urbanism, displacement, citizenship and gender.
