behorend bij het proefschrift "A functional approach to differential indexing – Combining perspectives from typology and corpus linguistics"

- 1. Differential indexing is often associated to factors such as animacy, identifiability or topicality across different languages. However, the exact manifestation of these factors has to be viewed language-specifically (this thesis).
- 2. Unlike other coding splits, differential indexing cannot be explained in terms of efficiency (this thesis).
- 3. The evaluation of systematic corpus annotation is necessary to investigate and do justice to the intricacies of marking splits (this thesis).
- 4. Differential indexing is not just about the absence/presence of marking, but variable index placement should be considered as an instance of the phenomenon as well (this thesis).
- 5. There are language features which have traditionally been conceived of as categorical, but whose investigation would benefit from approaching them in terms of gradience.
- 6. Linguists should be aware of the fact that the term "optionality" can mean different things in different accounts.
- 7. Linguistics is an empirical science, and should present itself as such.
- 8. Linguistics resembles a garden with multiple paths and it is sometimes hard to decide which one to follow.
- 9. The educational value of manga and anime is immense, for children as well as adults.
- 10. Being a post-doc has quite a few similarities with being the youngest of five children.
