CURRICULUM VITAE

Thomas Henquet is currently the Senior Legal Adviser/Chief of the Legal Office at the Registry of the International Criminal Court. He previously worked as a Legal Counsel at the International Law Division of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Netherlands. Admitted to the bar of Amsterdam (2003), he was an associate in the Litigation & Dispute Resolution practice/International Law Group of Clifford Chance LLP. His earlier career included being employed as a lawyer at the United Nations International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia.

Having acted as counsel to states, international organisations and private parties, Thomas has also been appointed by the Secretary-General of the Permanent Court of Arbitration as arbitrator in confidential arbitration cases.

Thomas enrolled in Leiden Law School, Leiden University, in 2011 to conduct PhD research under the supervision of Professor Dr. N.M. Blokker. A graduate of Sint-Maartenscollege (vwo, 1991) in Maastricht, he holds LLM degrees from the University of Amsterdam (1997) and Yale University (2002).
