

About the APH paper series

The intention of the APH series is to make information about the philatelic and postal history of Africa available for fellow philatelists, and for others who are interested in the political, economic, and cultural history of Africa. Most APH papers so far present an inventory of postage (and revenue) stamps of former colonies, and the aim is to be as complete as possible for stamps as such, and with special attention for covers and other elements of postal history, which can give historical information about postal communication, and about visual information through postal media. In addition it is the intention to be as complete as possible about postmarks, which show the history of postal coverage of colonial (and post-colonial) territories. Most information comes from websites. The APH papers are ‘work in progress’, and additional information plus corrections are welcome and can be added in future editions.

Organization of this APH paper: we follow a chronological order, and for each series of postage stamps we start with the collection of Vincent Prange, followed by additional illustrations that could be found online and in some publications. At the end we specifically deal with postmarks used in Oltre Giuba.

Introduction

The first post office [was] opened in Jubaland under British East African administration in 1896. Stamps were used from British East Africa, British East Africa & Uganda and Kenya & Uganda. The Italians, in 1925, issued the first set of stamps for Jubaland – these being Italian stamps overprinted 'Oltre Giuba'. A first set of definitives was issued in 1926. After annexation to Italian Somaliland, the stamps of Italian Jubaland were superseded by those of Italian Somaliland and, from 1960, by those of Somalia. "Oltre Giuba (Trans-Juba) was a short lived Italian colony in the south-western part of what is now Somalia. The territory was located on the far side of the Juba River from the existing borders of Italian Somaliland, hence the name "Trans Juba" or Oltre Giuba in Italian. The


formation of the colony had its origins at the start of World War I, when Italy was allied with Germany and Austria-Hungary. In a secret pact signed with Great Britain, France and Russia in Sept. of 1914, the Kingdom of Italy agreed to join the “Triple Entente” and declare war on Austro-Hungary and Germany within a month (this happened against Austria-Hungary but not until 1916 against Germany), for a share of agreed territorial gains after the war. This treaty included the agreement that in the event that France and Great Britain increased their colonial territories in Africa at the expense of Germany, Italy would be able to share in that claim. After the war, this pact was nullified by the Treaty of Versailles, primarily because President Woodrow Wilson did not support the Italian claims in many of the territorial expansions in the 1914 agreement. Only being awarded small tracts of Austrian territories, (but not Dalmatia as previously agreed), caused great political upheavals in Italy which ultimately resulted in a coup led by Mussolini’s Fascist Party.

One outcome, however, was the Anglo-Italian treaty of July 15, 1924, under which a northern portion of the Kenya territory, commonly called Jubaland or Trans-Juba, would be ceded to Italy. On June 29th, 1925, the treaty took effect, the British flag was lowered and Oltre Giuba, the newest Italian colony was born. The new colony didn’t last long, however, as one year later it was incorporated into greater Italian Somaliland”.



2 Italian occupation: Oltre Giuba, 1925 – 1926



"Italian Jubaland – which derives its name from the Jubba River – is located in eastern Africa. Jubaland is, in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, part of British East Africa and from 1920 Kenya. The capital of Kismayo is the last of the cities along the Benadir Coast that de jure still resides under the authority of the sultan of Zanzibar. The British, in 1924, agree to transfer Jubaland to Italy as compensation for Italy joining the Allies in WWI – the actual transfer to be effected in 1925. After a short period of existence as the separate Italian colony of Oltre Giuba – Italian for Trans Juba – Jubaland is annexed to Italian Somaliland in 1926. Kismayo is, at the same time, annexed from Zanzibar thus ending the – already for some time only nominal – rule of Zanzibar over the Benadir coast.

Currently Jubaland is part of Somalia – forming one of the regions that have gained a large amount of self-government since Somalia has become a federal republic in 2012".

1925 - Serie ordinaria Effigie di Vittorio Emanuele III tipo Michetti: 20c; 30c; 75c; L1.25; L2.50: "In fulfilment of the 1915 Treaty of London, Great Britain ceded part of Kenya to control by Italy on 15th July 1924, and until amalgamation with Italian Somalia, stamps were issued using Italian stamps overprinted Oltre Giuba. Just two commemorative sets were issued inscribed Oltre Giuba rather than being overprinted. Jubaland was incorporated into Italian Somalia on 30th June 1926. Main Definitive Set, 1925. 





1925 - Giubileo del re Vittorio Emanuele III: 60c; L1, L1.25; dent: 11. "Jubilee Set, 1925-6. The 60c and 1 lire were issued in November 1925, while the 1.25 lire was issued in July 1926 after Jubaland had been incorporated into Italian Somalia. All three stamps can be found in both perf 11 and perf 13½, but the 60c and 1 lire are very rare with the latter perforation, the 60c particularly so".




Collection Vincent Prange Oltre Giuba p. 7 upper part



4 After 1926

Jubaland became part of Italian Somaliland in 1926, and part of Italian East Africa in 1936. It was under British military administration after the Second World War and became part of the Italian administration on behalf of the United Nations until the Independence of Somalia in 1960. During the civil war in Somalia the area was occupied by Kenyan forces, and Kenya has been important ever since. UNOSOM also had its postal mark on the area in 1993.










Azania 2010-2013
