Rasmus Puggaard-Rode was born Rasmus Puggaard Hansen in Varde, Denmark in 1992. He finished his secondary education at Varde Gymnasium in 2011. During his PhD studies, he spent two months in 2018 working at Aarhus University, hosted by the Peter Skautrup Centre for Jutlandic Dialect Research, and three months in 2020 working at The Arctic University of Norway in Tromsø, hosted by the Center for Advanced Studies in Theoretical Linguistics. In 2021-2022, he briefly worked part time as lecturer at the University of Amsterdam. In 2022, he accepted a position as a postdoctoral research scientist in the Spoken Language Processing group at the Institute of Phonetics and Speech Processing, Ludwig Maximilian University, Munich.
