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Life of Phi Phi-features in West Germanic and the syntax-morphology interface

- 1. The feature-geometric organisation of phi-features restricts patterns of position dependent agreement in Dutch dialects.
- The distribution of phi-features on lexical items can lead to differences in word order.
- 3. The valency of phi-features is not the same across grammatical modules.
- 4. Clitic doubling is a two-step operation.
- 5. Microcomparative research can corroborate the results of large typological studies.
- Studying (dialects of) well-known languages will always be a fruitful endeavour.
- 7. Empirical linguistic phenomena should receive names that are neutral with respect to their analysis.
- 8. References of cited linguistic examples should include the page number of the source.
- 9. The best way to be productive is to take a break.
