Rice Eaters in the Land of Cheese:

The Context of Ethnic Socialization of Chinese-Dutch Children

- 1. Chinese-Dutch children evaluate their ethnic ingroup and the White outgroup most positively, and the Black outgroup least positively (this dissertation).
- 2. The pandemic brings more experiences of (subtle) discrimination and stronger ethnic identity among Chinese immigrant mothers living in the Netherlands (this dissertation).
- 3. Chinese immigrant mothers show color-evasive behaviors in interaction with their children (this dissertation).
- 4. Chinese immigrant mothers show patterns of ethnic-racial focus that reflect white normativity by focusing more on people of color than on White people (this dissertation).
- 5. There is an overrepresentation of White authors, illustrators, and characters, as well as the preference for white skin color in popular Chinese children's books (this dissertation).
- 6. A good understanding of parental and situational influences on children's interethnic prejudice is necessary.
- 7. Insights on interethnic attitudes and relations require investigating population-specific mechanisms.
- 8. Research on intergroup ideologies and behaviors requires culturally sensitive instruments.
