Curriculum Vitae

Gangyin Zhao (Chinese: 赵刚印) was born in Fuyang, Anhui province, China on June 24, 1992. He completed his secondary education at Xiamen No. 1 High School in 2011 and was subsequently admitted to the Department of Biology within the School of Life Sciences at Yunnan University later that same year. In 2015, after successfully earning his bachelor's degree, he furthered his academic journey by enrolling at the University of Science and Technology of China. There, he pursued his master's degree with a focus on Cytology within the School of Life Sciences. During his time in the Cell Dynamics Laboratory, his research predominantly revolved around cell mitosis and migration. One of his key accomplishments during this period involved employing CRISPR/Cas9 technology to insert various tag-proteins into specific gene sites, facilitating gene labeling at the cellular level. This process allowed for the tracking of dynamic cell mitosis. Additionally, he was involved in the synthesis and purification of human proteins using various systems, such as *E. coli* and the Bac to Bac plant virus system. His work extended to the investigation of protein structure and kinase dynamics, contributing to a broader understanding of these biological processes. In 2018, he completed his master's study and received his master's degree.

From December 2018 to June 2019, Zhao Gangyin commenced an internship at Beike Biology Company. During this period, he primarily focused on the research and development of Car-T cells.
