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## CURRICULUM VITAE

Tycho van der Hoog was born in Nieuwegein, the Netherlands, on 7 April 1993. He studied at Leiden University, where he obtained a BA degree in history and a BA degree in political science in 2014, a research MA degree in African studies in 2016, and a MA degree in history (*cum laude*) in 2017. Tycho worked at the Centre for Frugal Innovation in Africa, lectured in the BA Korean Studies program at Leiden University, and catalogued the private papers of the renowned Africanist Stephen Ellis. In 2019, he commenced his PhD research at the African Studies Centre of Leiden University. He has conducted extensive archival research in Namibia, South Africa, South Korea, Sweden, Switzerland, the United Kingdom, the United States, Zambia, and Zimbabwe. In 2019, both of his MA theses were published as monographs, respectively *Breweries, Politics and Identity* and *Monuments of Power*. His work also appeared in peer-reviewed journals such as *Cold War History*, *Africa Spectrum*, and *History in Africa* and several edited volumes. Tycho is one of the ‘Faces of Science’ of the Royal Netherlands Academy of Arts and Sciences and a recipient of the African Affairs Postgraduate Paper Prize of the British International Studies Association. He is also a Brewer of Honour at Namibia Breweries Limited. Since 2023, Tycho is employed at the Netherlands Defence Academy as an Assistant Professor of International Security Studies.
