Curriculum Vitae

Eline Lismont was born on 17 June 1994 in Sint-Truiden, Belgium. After completing a professional bachelor's degree in secondary education (English – Dutch) in 2015, she began a bridging year in Linguistics and Literary Studies at the Vrije Universiteit Brussel in 2016. In 2018, she graduated with greatest distinction, earning a master's degree in Linguistics and Literary Studies: Dutch. During her master's program, Eline worked as a student assistant in the team of prof. dr. Rik Vosters. In October 2018, she was appointed as a teaching assistant for Dutch linguistics. That same year, she collaborated with prof. dr. Rik Vosters on a successful grant application to the Research Foundation Flanders (FWO) for the research project that would become her PhD.
