## *Curriculum Vitae*

Wahyu Widodo was born in Ngawi, East Java, Indonesia, on 22 April 1984. He earned his BA degree from the Faculty of Letters at the State University of Malang in 2007, and his master's degree in descriptive linguistics from Sebelas Maret University, Surakarta in 2012. During this year, he was selected to take part in a short-term fellowship in the Asian Graduate Student Fellowships (AGSF) program at the Asia Research Institute, National University of Singapore (ARI-NUS). His master's thesis was published by UB Press (2018) as a monograph under the title *Mantra Kidung Jawa: Mengurai yang Lingual hingga yang Transendental* (Javanese Incantatory Poems: An Exploration of Linguistic Elements and Transcendental Aspects).
