## **Propositions**

- 1. Maintaining self while adapting is the best way for international teachers to develop as well-rounded professionals. (this dissertation)
- 2. Teaching overseas significantly enhances teachers' professional development by prompting critical self-reflection and identity refinement. (this dissertation)
- 3. Intercultural competence should be considered a mandatory professional skill for teachers to operate effectively in global educational contexts. (this dissertation)
- 4. In intercultural settings abroad, international teachers need to be redefined as agentic professionals who can enrich the pedagogical landscape, not as transient workers. (this dissertation)
- 5. Teacher identity development should be viewed not just as an individual journey but as a process shaped by the school environment and broader education policies. (this dissertation)
- 6. Inclusive pedagogical approaches are essential for fostering teacher identity development.
- 7. Effective teaching strategies demand flexibility, cultural sensitivity, and continuous reflective practice.
- 8. Policies and practices that actively validate diverse cultural experiences significantly strengthen teachers' teacher identity development.
- 9. People are spending more time curating their lives online than actually living them.
- 10. Being busy is often mistaken for being important.
- 11. A fulfilling life requires both disciplined effort and the unapologetic pursuit of joy.
- 12. The abundance of choice in modern life often leads to more anxiety rather than greater freedom.
