CURRICULUM VITAE

Kauthar Khamis attended high school at Ghana-Lebanon Islamic Senior High School in Accra, Ghana. She holds a bachelor of arts degree in the Study of Religions and History from the University of Ghana, and a research master in the Study of Religions (Islamic Studies Option) from the University of Ghana. Khamis worked as an assistant lecturer at the Islamic University College, Ghana, where she taught a number of courses at the Religious Studies Department. Her PhD research, which commenced in 2018, focused on the beauty practices of Muslim and Christian women in Madina Zongo, located in Accra, Ghana. The PhD project was carried out in collaboration with the African Studies Centre, Leiden University, Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies, Utrecht University and Institute of African Studies, University of Ghana.
