CURRICULUM VITAE

Nur Ahmad was born on 25 November 1990 in Semarang, Central Java, Indonesia. He received foundational religious education from two *pesantrens*: Pesantren al-Itqan, Semarang, and Pesantren al-Bahraniyya, Demak. He continued his studies by earning a B.A. in 2015 from the Faculty of Ushuluddin (Principles of Religion) at Universitas Islam Negeri Walisongo Semarang. In 2017, he received an M.A. in theology and religious studies from Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam, which was financed by the 5000-doctors' program of the Ministry of Religious Affairs. In 2018, he became a lecturer at his alma mater, Universitas Islam Negeri Walisongo Semarang, and ever since, he has been teaching Qur'ān exegesis, Islamic manuscripts, Islam in Java, and Islamic mysticism. He has published two books (both in 2020) and several academic articles in *Teosofia: Indonesian Journal of Islamic Mysticism* (2017), *Ulumuna* (2017, 2019), and *Journal of the Muhyiddin Ibn 'Arabi Society* (2025). Concurrent with his doctoral studies at Leiden University (started 2022), he served as the chairman of the Netherlands Special Branch of Nahdlatul Ulama from 2023 to 2026. Upon completing his Ph.D., he will return to his teaching position at Universitas Islam Negeri Walisongo Semarang and continue his research on Islamic mysticism.
